# SESSION1: INTRODUCTION TO JOY

# SERIES OVERVIEW:

"Joy. It's not getting what you want; it's appreciating what you have. Joy isn't always the easiest choice or the obvious choice, but joy is a choice. The Apostle Paul said, "Rejoice in the Lord always. I will say it again, rejoice!" And his life is louder than his words. Paul writes his letter to the Philippians from a prison cell. You can choose joy anywhere, anytime, anyway!"

## OPENING DISCUSSION

- What does the word 'joy' mean to you?
- With the person next to you or as a whole group, share about a time when you have felt most joyful

The theme of joy – and specifically of joy in the Lord – is found throughout scripture, both Old and New Testament. Throughout history, God's people have rejoiced in response to God's character, his blessing and his deliverance. Jesus brings joy to those who follow him and experience his healing and redemptive power. Scripture teaches us that joy is a gift from God, rooted in who He is, and that it is something to be celebrated and shared with others.

READ: PSALM 66:1-12

Discuss: Is there are lationship between our joy and our worship?
