Lavonne Janette Schow was born on November 29, 1952, in Willmar, Minnesota, the daughter of Spencer and Elnore (Zahnow) Kostad. She grew up in Willmar and graduated from Willmar High School in 1971. On September 25, 1971, Lavonne married her high school sweetheart, Kim Schow. They were married for over 53 years and were blessed with two children, Jennifer and Matthew. They made their home on a farm near Blomkest for 10 years and then moved to Svea for 5 years prior to moving to Willmar.

She was a stay-at-home mom until 1978, when she began working at the Community Action Agency. In 1989, she began employment at WPC (now called Select Genetics) and retired 30 years later in 2019. In 2020, Lavonne started having medical issues and became very ill in 2022. She was a cancer survivor.
