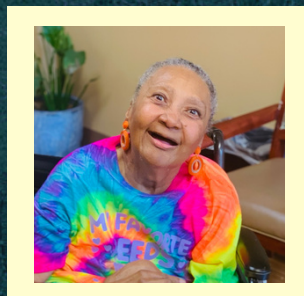

Sis. Washington was born August 7, 1940 to Rev. Edward and Sis. Daisy Parker in a little house at 615 General Taylor Street. Her life always encompassed family love and devotion. Her home served as a welcoming place for all who had a desire to experience the true meaning of family. No one felt alone when in Glen's presence. Her love for children was beyond compare. Planning trips to Disney World for the children of the church, enjoying excursions with them at the skating rink, taking her grandchildren on adventures only she and they shared. These are just a few of her numerous extensions of love and compassion.

Glen Doris was baptized at an early age at Second Baptist 6th District by Rev. Paul Walker Raphel. She and Sis. Parker worshipped there until 1950 when they left to join Parker Jr. and Rev. Parker as he was called to pastor the Austerlitz Street Baptist Church. At Austerlitz she became president of the mass choir, deaconess, “travel agent” for church trips, and even did detail as Austerlitz's security guard.

The public schools of New Orleans served as her foundation and years at Dillard provided the knowledge needed for her advancement in later professions. She advanced from a crossing guard to the Sheriff's Department and later to the New Orleans Police Department as Correctional Officer.

She was married to Junius Washington and from this union came three children, Quinton, Sherman and Nedra Washington. She loved her children and worked hard to provide the things they needed.

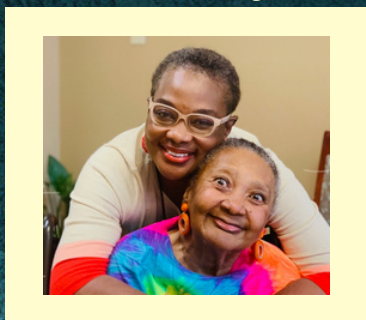
