IF TEARS COULD BUILD A STAIRWAY


If tears could build a stairway, and memories a lane, I would walk right up to heaven and bring you home again.

Dirk Thomas Fischer of Colleyville, TX was born on August 2, 1949, and entered eternal life November 8, 2023.

Dirk was born in Kenmare ND, to Thomas A. Fischer and Priscilla (Thompson) Fischer. He grew up and graduated from high school, in Bottineau, ND. Dirk worked at the Red Owl grocery store as a teenager and had fond memories of working with his high school friend Dennis. He was active in high school band, and often accompanied soloists on the piano.

Dirk took a job in oil and gas in Texas in the early 2000's. His family later joined him in Texas, and they made their home there.

Everyone who knew Dirk, knew that his favorite band was always Don Henley and the Eagles. He liked boats and mustang cars and had more than one over the years. When he was younger, he liked to play tennis. He enjoyed following numerous sports, but hockey seemed to be his favorite. Dirk and Elaine enjoyed vacationing and went on several trips over the years for which they had great memories. They particularly enjoyed travelling to Florida with their children, family members and friends. Their children, Nathan and Andrea, brought them much joy and were a big part of their lives over the years. Dirk had many cousins he was fond of, as well as his aunt Joan who made him caramel rolls.

He is survived by his wife, Elaine; son, Nathan; daughter, Andrea; brother, Brent (Marilyn); and sister, Terresa (Kenneth).
