

Terry passed away Monday morning, November 20, at Bethesda Grand in Willmar following a courageous fight against lung cancer at the age of 83.


He is survived by his loving wife, Deb of Spicer; one sister, Jacquelyn Fritzke of Watertown; besides other relatives and many friends.
