Ola Mae Hicks-Boatwright was born in Union Springs, Alabama on November 23, 1929, 94 years ago to Hannah Scott and Tommie Clark. Her mother had 3 girls and she was the youngest child.

She was educated in Bulloch County of Union Springs school system. Up until the age of 54, she was a housewife before opening her own personal care home.

Mother Ola Mae Hicks-Boatwright served faithfully at Thankful Baptist Church as a treasure on the pastoral committee, and a faithful choir member. Even as a member of Thankful Baptist Church, she helped out with yard sales for the boy's academy at St. Paul. She sold clothes and furniture for the boys. She would sell dinners and raise money for the church. In her later years, she became one of the mothers at Graceful Gospel Church. She always would say she love her plants like she loved her children. She always would say, "give her flowers while she's living, so she could enjoy them." Throughout her life, she helped raised her grands and great grands.

She started a personal care home in her late 50's and named it Ola's Place, "she spoiled all her elderly residents for eleven years, until she began having health issues. She carefully placed her residents with other providers she trusted.

Two of her favorite songs were "COME BY HERE MY LORD" and I'M SATISFIED WITH JESUS'. She loved to praise the lord and loved singing hymns.

On Saturday, March 2, 2024, at home with her family she peacefully and quietly entered into eternal life. She was preceded in death by both parents; her husband (Ezekiel Boatwright), all her siblings; her three sons Jimmy L. (Catherine) Clark Sr., Willie Lee Hicks Jr.) and Tommie Edward Hicks.
