He enlisted with the Minnesota National Guard in May of 1966 and was honorably discharged in May of 1972 after six years of service.

Robert married the love of his life, Carol Olson, on November 11, 1967, at Zion Lutheran Church in Ortonville, MN. They lived in Arizona for a few months but returned to Minnesota and settled in Eden Prairie.
