Lee, 2 children: Shannon (Joe) Thomas and Troy Lee (Terry Treadway), grandchildren: Vanessa, Jessica, and Otto Braided Hair, Breanne, Taylor, Brekken, and Austin Small, Bradley and Ashley Thomas, and Tyler Lee, 12 great-grandchildren and numerous nieces and nephews that filled her with love, happiness, and respect.
