Ask any of her friends or family and they will tell you that Lynette always had a good story or joke to tell. Her quick wit and contagious laugh brought smiles to many. She liked children, although she never had any of her own, they seemed to just gravitate to her. She especially enjoyed her nieces and nephews, great-nieces and cousins. Unlike the rest of the Fitterer family, Lynette never played cards and instead choose to entertain the younger relatives with made-up games, Donald Duck impersonations, and outdoor excursions. For many years, she played Santa Claus for numerous families in the area. She loved to help others and would give you the shirt off her back if she could.
