His Life Story

Tyrone Alfonso McFarland, affectionately known as "Ty & Monch" at 72 years young, died Sunday May 5, 2024 peacefully and comfortably at home with family by his side.

Tyrone was born September 2, 1951 in Philadelphia, PA where he was raised by his late mother Helen Jones and late stepfather George Jones Sr. He was the oldest of three male siblings all raised in this home. Later in life, Tyrone was blessed with a daughter Zalease McFarland from his previous marriage.

Tyrone grew up in North Philadelphia where he attended Simon Gratz High School and graduated with a HS School diploma in 1971. After graduating he landed an industrial job working at a Steel Mill with his uncle Donald located in Northeast Philadelphia. Tyrone loved working here for many years but due to the US economic downturn the manufacturer closed down permanently in 1988. Due to the Steel Mill closure, Tyrone secured a job as a maintenance technician at John Wanamaker Building in Center City and later Sheppard Detective System, Inc. as a security guard.

Tyrone was such a charismatic person and a lover of music. As a musician he played in numerous bands in the 70's like Harold Melvin and the Blue Notes and was on-call for numerous singers when they would tour in Philadelphia. In 1995, Ty joined the International F & A.M. Mason of Roman Lodge No. 137. In his pastime you could find Ty at band practice or down in his basement on 7th Street playing his bass guitar, listening to music, tinkering with electronics, polishing his guns, and writing different music scripts. Tyrone not only spent time with family but didn't mind beating us at a good game of backgammon or cards. If you knew him well, his most enjoyable time spent on this earth was playing his guitar but being a Son, Brother, Father, Husband, Grandfather, and Friend.

As we remember the good times we shared, God called our son home to spread his wings with his mother Helen Jones, father James Edsell, stepfather George Jones Sr., brother George Jones Jr. aka Butta, uncle Donald McFarland, stepson Tyrone Pollard, and his dear sister on his father's side all preceded him in death.

Tyrone leaves to cherish: his wife Daisy McFarland of Upper Darby, PA; daughter Zalease McFarland & step-daughter Sylvia Turner of Elkins Park, PA; Brother Donald Jones aka Pete and sister-in-law Gloria Jones of Philadelphia, PA; sister-in-law Gladys Jones of Philadelphia, PA; four grandchildren: Tonisha Pollard, Antonio Pollard Sr., Sybiar Turner, and Summer Turner; four great-grandchildren: Antonio Pollard Jr., Jolina Pollard, Jy'sr Benson and Jaishon Lucisno; very special best friend Chico; and host of nieces, nephews, family and friends.
