ALPHONSO Benjamin Varner

November 4, 2022 11:00 AM Saint Peter AME Church 502 State University Drive • Fort Valley, GA Alphonso Benjamin Varner, affectionately called "Hubba Hubba" was born December 21, 1928 in West Palm Beach, FL to the parentage of Voley Williams and Estella D. Varner. He had four sisters and one brother who have preceded him in death. His early childhood church was Payne Chapel A.M.E. Church, West Palm Beach, FL.

Upon graduating from Industrial High School, West Palm Beach, FL, he continued to further his education by earning his B.S. and Master Ed. degrees from Florida A&M University, Tallahassee, FL, where he played football and later coached. His mentor was the legendary Coach Jake Gaither. His football accomplishments include: Two-time All American Tackle 1950 and 1951 at FAMU and All Alaska Tackle in 1953.

He became Head Football Coach of Edward Waters College in Jacksonville, FL., and later moved to Fort Valley where he was named the first Instructor of Military Science & Tactics at Fort Valley State College (now University), and was also an Assistant Professor of Military Science. At this fine institution he would later become an Assistant Professor of Health and Physical Education and Defensive Coordinator for FVSC Wildcats, known as "Blue Death" Defense. Under his tutelage and which he took pride in, many of his football players achieved successful accomplishments in professions, to include professional football.

While working at Fort Valley State, he continued his African Methodist Episcopal roots and joined Saint Peter A.M.E. Church in 1958, where he served in many capacities. The current pastor of Saint Peter A.M.E. Church is the Reverend A. Angelo Dixon. He was a Trustee (Emeritus), and also served on the Sons of Allen Ministry, Lay Organization, and was the Coordinator of Meals on Wheels. He was voted as the Sixth Episcopal District's Layperson of the Year in 2006, which was a high point in his Christian life. In 2018, he was inducted into the Sons of Allen Ministry Hall of Fame. One of his favorite verses is Micah 6:8 which reads, "He hath shewed thee, O man, what is good; and what doth the Lord require of thee, but to do justly, and to love mercy, and to walk humbly with thy God."

Brother Varner was an active member of Fred Douglas Lodge #143 F & AM., PHA for over 50 years, and was honored by the Lodge for that accomplishment on April 1, 2017 with an elegant recognition/celebration banquet at Fort Valley State University Pettigrew Center. Brother Varner received his 50 year pin for 50 continuous years of membership with the Lodge, along with a Life Membership plaque. The Lodge also established a scholarship in his name at The Fort Valley State University. He served as Assistant Secretary for over 20 years. Brother Varner participated in many of the Masonic Lodge's community outreach programs, such as issuing fruit baskets and Christmas cards to residents of Fort Valley Health Care Center and Virginia Gardens Assisted Living Center on Christmas Day. In 2018 he received a Certificate of Appreciation from Peach County Retired Educators and in 2019, he also received an Emeritus Plaque from Georgia Retired Educators Association.

In 1988, Coach Varner retired from FVSU. He was also a retired Lieutenant Colonel of the U.S. Army. In 1983, he was inducted into Florida A & M Sports Hall of Fame; and in 1997 the Wall of Fame. That same year, Coach received an FVSU Distinguish Service Award. In 1998 Coach was inducted into the Southern Intercollegiate Athletics Conference (SIAC) Hall of Fame and FVSU Hall of Fame in 2010. He was a life member of the American Football Coaches Association (AFCA), and was also a proud member of Kappa Alpha Psi Fraternity. He was initiated into the Alpha Xi Chapter of the Kappa Alpha Psi Fraternity at Florida A&M University in 1952. Among other endeavors, he found time to remain active with various ministries of his church, the Peach County Retired Educators Association, and the Fred Douglas Lodge #143 F & AM., Prince Hall Affiliated.

He was married to the late Juanita Edwards Varner, and had three daughters who are deceased: Denise V. Jackson, Gina Varner, Wanda Chambers and one granddaughter, Tracie McNabb, who also preceded him in death.

He leaves to cherish his memory, his loving wife, Mrs. Maggie L. Varner, their daughters: Desiree V. O'Bryant (Samuel), and Brenda Henley; five grandchildren: Thaddeus (Lisa) Jackson, Lagwana Brown, Lelita (Antonio) Fuller, Jerrell Howard, Frances O'Bryant; ten great grandchildren and a host of loving and caring nieces, nephews, in-laws and friends.
