#### Rev Alan writes...

#### **Annual Meetings and our APCM**

I am looking forward to joining St Andrew's for their annual meeting this Sunday. It's a happy occasion where we look back with gratitude for the many blessings and achievements of the last year and look forward with anticipation for all that God will do in the coming year. It's also the occasion where details of their finances are shared, and their leadership team are appointed.

Last Sunday I joined Smithills, and just before Easter I joined Barrow Bridge for their annual meetings, and I am delighted that they both have appointed their leadership teams and have a strong sense of vision and direction for the year ahead.



We don't have a separate annual meeting for St Peter's as this is included in our parish-wide annual meeting, called the APCM (Annual Parochial Church Meeting), although we may consider establishing an annual meeting for St Peter's in future years.

Our APCM takes place on **Sun 19 May, 4pm at St Peter's**. This is the occasion where we report on activities across all our fellowships, our accounts are presented, and we elect our Churchwardens, Deanery Synod Representatives, and PCC members (Parochial Church Council), which is the governing body with legal responsibility for our parish as a registered charity.

I would like to highlight a few things about our APCM, which I hope helps us all better understand what's involved and how we can all play our part. Firstly, everyone is encouraged to attend, but to be eligible to vote in the election of our PCC members each adult needs to be registered on our parish-wide Electoral Roll. It is a simple process to be added to this list and it is an important way of showing your commitment to our parish. The number of people registered on our Electoral Roll reflects the size of our parish and has a bearing on how resources and clergy are allocated to us by Manchester Diocese. Registration forms are available at all our services or from the parish office. Can I please encourage you to register if you haven't already.

Secondly, there are vacancies for new people to join our PCC or become a Deanery Synod Representative. The Deanery Synod is the governing body which oversees the business across Bolton Deanery, it has influence on strategy and the allocation of resources and forms a key part of governance structure together with all seven deaneries which form Manchester Diocese. As one of the biggest parishes in the diocese we are allocated 7 positions for Deanery Synod Reps, although we have been unable to recruit enough people to fill them all in previous years. So please do consider being a PCC member or a Deanery Synod Rep. If you'd like to explore the idea, please do get in contact with me.

Thirdly, this year one of our Churchwardens, Elian Winstanley concludes a sixyear term of office. Any of us who know Elian will appreciate the fantastic job he does and has done during his time as warden, especially during the interregnum (vacancy period) after our last Vicar Paul Hardingham



retired and before I was appointed. This means we are on the lookout to find a new warden – this can be anyone from any of our fellowships. So again, if you'd like to explore the idea, please do get in contact with me or our wardens, Phil Weaver or Elian. They will tell you how rewarding it is to serve as a warden and the huge benefit it brings to our parish life and ministry.


