He always loved motorcycles, from dirt bikes to road bikes, and even raced some in senior motocross. He loved studying family history, became an accomplished hobby genealogist, and even published historical accounts in the Franklin County Virginia Historical Society. Remote control (RC) planes were also a passion for most of his life. He loved to collect, build, tinker with, and of course, fly them. Until a few years ago, he was an active member of the Crystal Coast RC Club.

Wayne was fortunate to grow up with a large host of cousins, aunts, and uncles. He loved to take part in and host family reunions over the years. The stories of family adventures were some of his best. Wayne remained close to his cousins and did his best to keep all informed of family happenings. His interests and hobbies provided him with countless friends all over. As difficult as the goodbyes were, the family experienced much joy in listening in on the calls, texts, and visits in his last weeks from numerous family and friends.

Wayne loved his family. In addition to the many celebrations, he enjoyed attending his beloved grandchildren's countless sporting and school events. Wayne moved permanently to the North Carolina coast area in 2010, but his heart remained in Franklin County, Virginia where his extended family grew up and where he bought property with his father in 1966. "The Farm" was indeed his happy place, and he and Della were able to spend a lot of time there in recent years.

Most importantly, Wayne loved Jesus. He and his wife, Della, relied heavily on their faith for all things but especially through his over four-year illness. We are thankful he is resting in peace, and receiving his heavenly reward.
