In his young adult years, Lannie enjoyed competing in the rodeo arena, team roping and steer wrestling. He loved spending time outdoors. When he wasn't working you would find him relaxing at the cabin on the lake or playing a round of golf. Lannie was an avid hunter and fisherman. Not only did he hunt and fish locally, he was blessed to travel the United States, and even to Canada to partake in the pastimes he loved. He passed his love of the great outdoors on to his kids and grandkids, taking every opportunity he could, to spend time enjoying it with them. His family was a source of pride for Lannie. If there was a game or competition his kids or grandkids were competing in, you could find him on the sidelines cheering them on.
