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### LETTER OF ACCREDITATION FOR TRAINING PROVIDED BY CHARIS LYNN CURTIS, EVOLUTIONARY COACH

June 28, 2018

On the strength of our review of your application and of the letter of support received today from Patricia Starr, the Indigenous Certification Board of Canada (ICBOC) confirms that the training entitled Origin Healing for Professionals, that you developed and delivered, satisfies ICBOC's standards and requirements for training accreditation. The forty-eight (48) hours of training offered from March 12<sup>th</sup> to March 19<sup>th</sup>, 2018 can be applied by the training participants toward their ICBOC certification or recertification.

We have reviewed the topics, content, methods and cultural relevance of the Origin Healing for Professionals training, as well as your cultural competence as the facilitator delivering the training. Our conclusion concurs with the perspective expressed in the letter of support provided to us by the Gya' Wa' Tlaab Healing Centre Society's Executive Director, Patricia Starr, who requested the training for the benefit of NNADAP and other workers in mental wellness and addictions.

As Origin Healing for Professionals has been specifically requested and supported by a NNADAP treatment centre, the accreditation is offered free of charge by ICBOC. However, please note that this training accreditation is limited to the event and period stipulated in the contract with the Gya' Wa' Tlaab Healing Centre Society, in this case the training that occurred from the 12<sup>th</sup> to the 19<sup>th</sup> of March.

If you provide the same training to another Indigenous client who is not funded by NNADAP, fees will then apply. However, if the same client requests again the same accredited training, the accreditation will stand, and the same protocol will apply in regard to the limited period for which the accreditation will be granted a second or third time. All that is required each time is the official confirmation of the contract and the training dates from the client, in this instance the Gya' Wa' Tlaab Healing Centre Society.

As the letter of support required to finalize the accreditation arrived after the training occurred, the accreditation applies retroactively, so that the hours documented on the training certificate given to all participants will be applied to their certification or recertification. Applicants for ICBOC professional certification are required to submit certificates as proof of training, we thank you for ensuring that participants are provided with these certificates.
