



Roger Vernon Pieske, son of Merritt and Elvira (Mude) Pieske, was born on March 1, 1946, in Springfield, Minnesota. Roger attended the Cyrus School District, and graduated from Cyrus High School in 1964. After high school, he continued his education at the Wahpeton State School of Science and Technology, earning his Associates Degree in Diesel Mechanics. Roger and Janice Graves were united in marriage in 1966, and welcomed two children: Paula and Greg. Roger's career included: Bill Dripps' Garage in Morris, the Cyrus Farmers Elevator Company in Cyrus, and lastly, farming with his dad and brother on the family farm.

It would be an understatement to say that Roger was an active volunteer and leader in the community that he loved so much!
