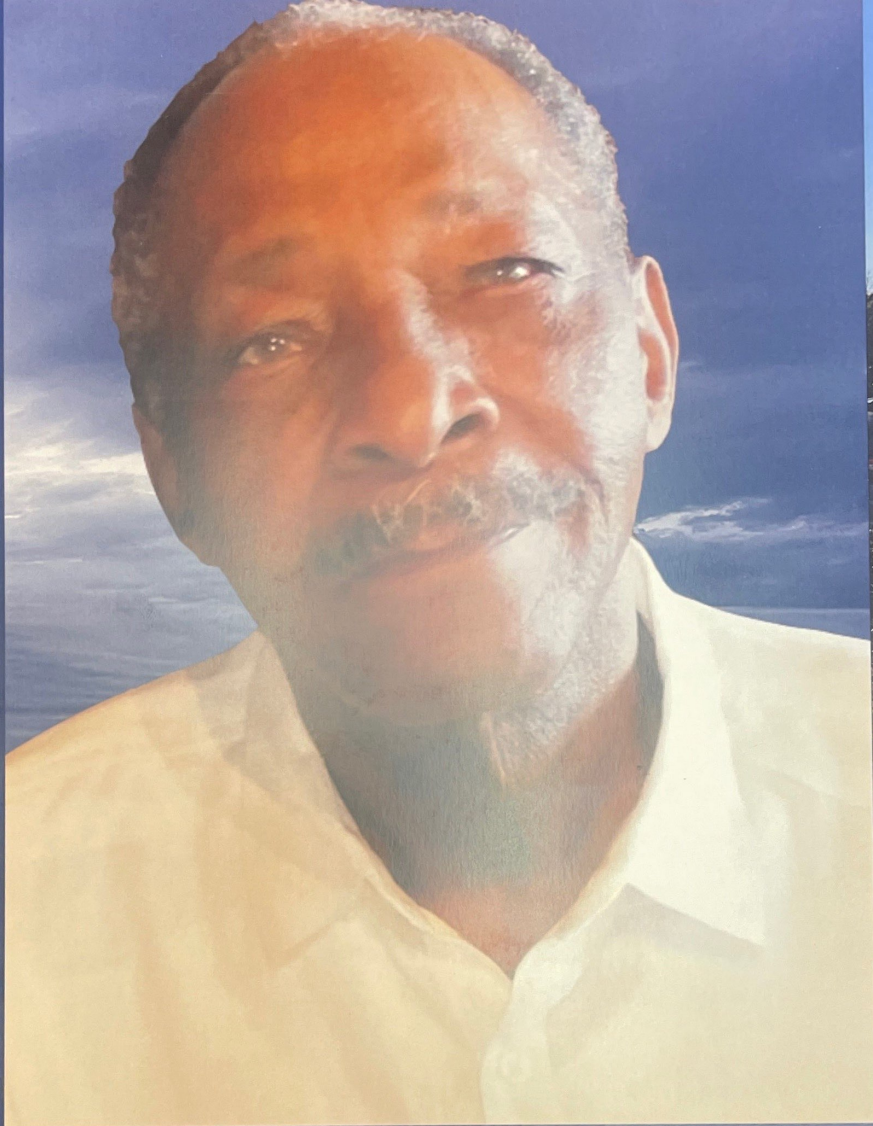

Obituary

Edward Johnson, Sr. was born in Opelousas, LA to Carlton and Beatrice Johnson on September 4, 1931, one of ten children. He transitioned from this life into the next on November 11, 2021, in Houston, TX.

Edward, or Ed to his family and friends, was always ready with a kind word or just something to make you smile. He wore many hats and depending on who you ask you might learn that he was the best fisherman, landscaper, cook, baker, builder, and entrepreneur. Indeed, there are pockets in the city where even today you can see his handiwork. He used his talents both in the service of the Lord and to provide for his family, friends, and community.

After serving in the United States Army from January 17, 1951 until January 28, 1954, he was discharged from Camp Chaffee in Arkansas. He worked at the Pollock Paper Company as a delivery driver and retired after 30 years.

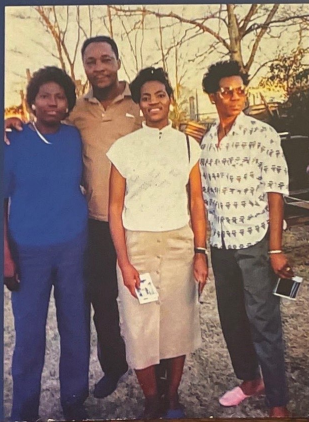
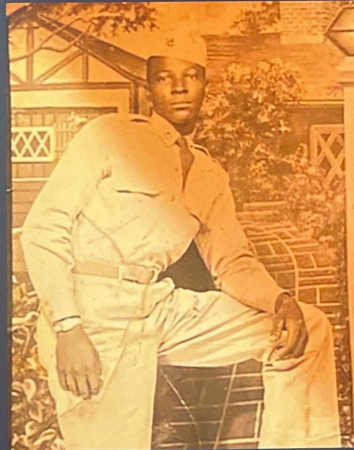
