Her Story

Barbara Blake Moss was the second daughter born to the late Reverend Herbert Blake and Ruthell Commodore Blake on January 10, 1946, in Charleston, SC.

Barbara attended Red Top Elementary School in 1951. She continued her education at Wallace Consolidated Schools where she matriculated in advanced classes and graduated at the age of 16. Barbara went to college at Barber Scotia College in Concord, North Carolina where she studied English, French and, Music. Barbara sang on the choir there and participated in many piano and voice recitals with her sister Juanita. Barbara graduated from college with a major in English and a minor in French. She then went on to receive a Master's Degree in Education from South Carolina State University. In 1962, seeking to fulfill her lifelong dream to become an educator, Barbara gained employment as an English Teacher at Bonds Wilson High School.

After integration, Mrs. Moss began teaching at Stall High School until she acquired the position as English and drama teacher at St. John's High School. While at St. John's High School, Mrs. Moss was instrumental in assisting countless students to obtain scholarships and awards for speech and drama. Mrs. Moss was also an adviser to the Gospel Choir. She directed numerous plays such as Purlie, Raisin in the Sun, and The WIZ. Mrs. Moss helped to developed many students with their articulation, enunciation and pontification skills as an English teacher and continued to assist students well into college helping them write thesis statements and term papers. Mrs. Moss retired from St. John's High School after 42 years of service to educating the youth in our community. Mrs. Moss was also a servant leader. In the community, she served on the board of directors at Fetter Health and worked tirelessly for her beloved alumni organization Barbara Scotia College.

Putting God first in her life, BARBARA sought the Lord at an early age and solidified her spiritual bond with Christ. She joined Bethel AME Church under the leadership of the late Reverend S. C. Boston. Barbara praised God through her music ministry as Organist, Piano Teacher, and Choir Director for her home church Bethel AME Red Top and several AME churches through the years. Where her father, the late Rev. Herbert Blake, accepted the appointment to pastor, Barbara followed. She served as Minister of Music and Choral Director at Bethel AME Edisto, St. John's AME, Johns Island, Bethel AME Jacksonboro, Calvary AME Jacksonboro, Bethel AME Saint George, Mount Pisgah AME, Bethel AME, and New Hope AME, Ridgeville, South Carolina.
