His daughters’ fondest memories of their father include the many fishing trips they took when they were younger.

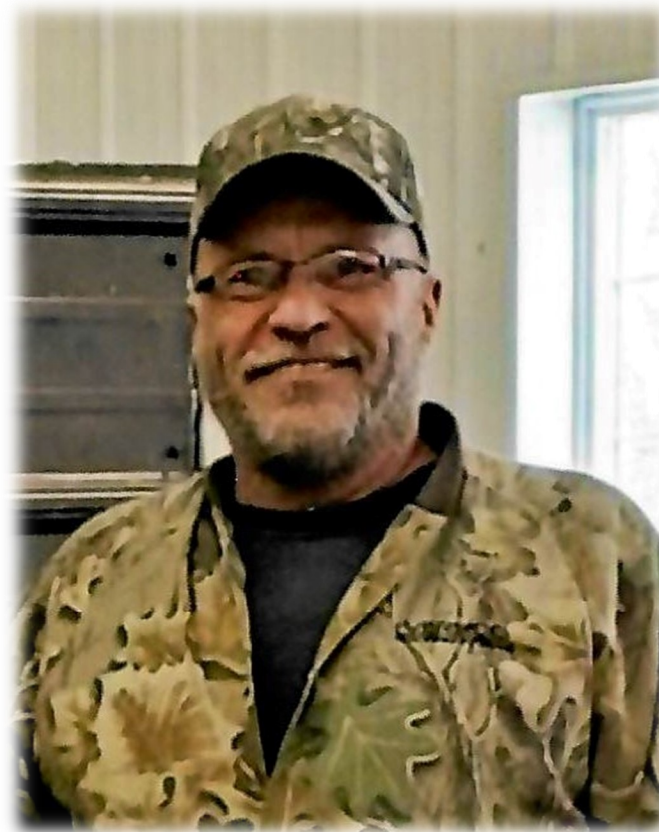
