Patricia Minton Taylor, 73, of Oakland died at 6:57 a.m., Saturday, March 19, 2011 at the Medical Center at Bowling Green.

The Mayfield, Kentucky native was a professor of English at Western Kentucky University for 43 years. She was a member of the Episcopal faith and was a founding member of Horse Cave Theatre and Public Theatre of Kentucky and appeared in many of their productions. She was commissioned a Kentucky Colonel by Gov. Happy Chandler. An original cast member of the Everyman Players', The Book of Job, she performed in England and at The Brussels World's Fair. She hosted the Reeves Cash Jackpot Drawing for four years. She has recently portrayed Mary Todd Lincoln for Hobson House and WKU's Kentucky Museum and Linda Loman in PTK's Death of a Saleman. She was the daughter of the late Thomas Jewell Minton and Mildred Hammond Minton.

Memorial service will be held Sunday, March 27, 2011 from 1:00-5:00 p.m. at Hardy & Son Funeral Home, Bowling Green Chapel.
