

Ms. Ida Mae Hagins Bowers

A Time to Be Born

Ida Mae Hagins Bowers was born January 27, 1944, to the late Rillie Jacobs Hagins and the late Allard Hagins, in Savannah, Georgia. Ida was the only child to her parents. Due to the death of her mother, Ida was raised by her devoted Aunt and Uncle, Hattie and Lee Van Oliver. Ida was very devoted to the both of them until their death. She was also preceded in death by her husband of twenty –two years (22) Ivan Bowers.

A Time to Plant

Ida received her formal education from the Chatham County Public School System, graduating from Sophronia M. Tompkins High School, Savannah, Georgia. Ida further her education by attending the New York Business College, developing exceptional Secretarial. She was hired as an Executive Administrative Assistant by ITT and later Chase Morgan.

Ida returned to Savannah in 1987 to be close to her family. For several years she was Self Employed as an Administrative Assistant, preparing reports for Businesses and Students. Ida was known for her outstanding skills in the typewriter and later the computer. She was the Administrative Assistant at Greater Gaines Chapel AME Church for two years. In 1997, she became the Administrative Assistant at St. Philip Monumental AME Church. Because of her business talents and operation of the church office, Ida was promoted to Office Administrator in 1999. She held that position until her death.

A Time to Serve

Ida joined St. Philip Monumental AME Church at a young age under the leadership of Rev. W.C. Davis. After returning from New York, Ida renewed her membership at St. Philip Monumental under the leadership of the late Rev. Charles W. Pitts. Ida was a very faithful, loyal, and dedicated member, indeed a Soldier in God's Army. She was blessed to have served under several outstanding Pastors: Retired Presiding Elder James E. Taylor, Rev. Dr. Lewis E. Logan, II, the late Rev. Walter Daniels, Rev. Dr. George A. Moore, Jr., and Rev. Dr. Bernard Clarke. Ida served on Several Boards and Organizations in the Church: The Steward Board, Lay Organization, Annie Roberts Jaudon Missionary Society, and Gospel Choir. Ida served as the Recording Secretary of the Church for several years and the District Steward. She also served as the Chairperson for Allen and Turner Day, The Souvenir Journal Committee for several programs, and the Annual Conference. Ida helped to coordinate the business office during the Annual Conferences. She was also active on the St. Philip Monumental Church Directory Committee, the St. Philip Monumental Historical Committee.

Because of Ida's love and faithfulness to the Lord, as well as her church, she represented St. Philip Monumental on several levels. She was the District Secretary for the following Presiding Elders: Elder Henry Frasier, Sr., deceased Elder Thomas J. Kent, and Retired Elder James E. Taylor. She was also an Elected Delegate to the Lay Biennial and the State Lay Convention. Ida served on the following Committees: Presiding Elder Salary and Upkeep; 6th Episcopal District Lay Organization 1st Handbook; 6th Episcopal District Church Directory; 6th Episcopal District Get Out and Vote Campaign; and Victory Over Violence.

A Time to Embrace

Ida was a person who loved her family and her friends. And she often displayed that with her cooking skills. Ida loved cooking many dinners for those she loved. Everyone who was blessed with her meals always complimented her. There were times when she might not have been feeling her best; but she was determined to be in the kitchen cooking up a delicious dinner. Ida was a devoted aunt to her nephew Patrick Rountree who she helped raised which led to her undying love for Nikki Williams Rountree and their children. Ida would always embrace and celebrate the birthdays of several of her cousins. She was "Ida Mae."
