He set me free.*

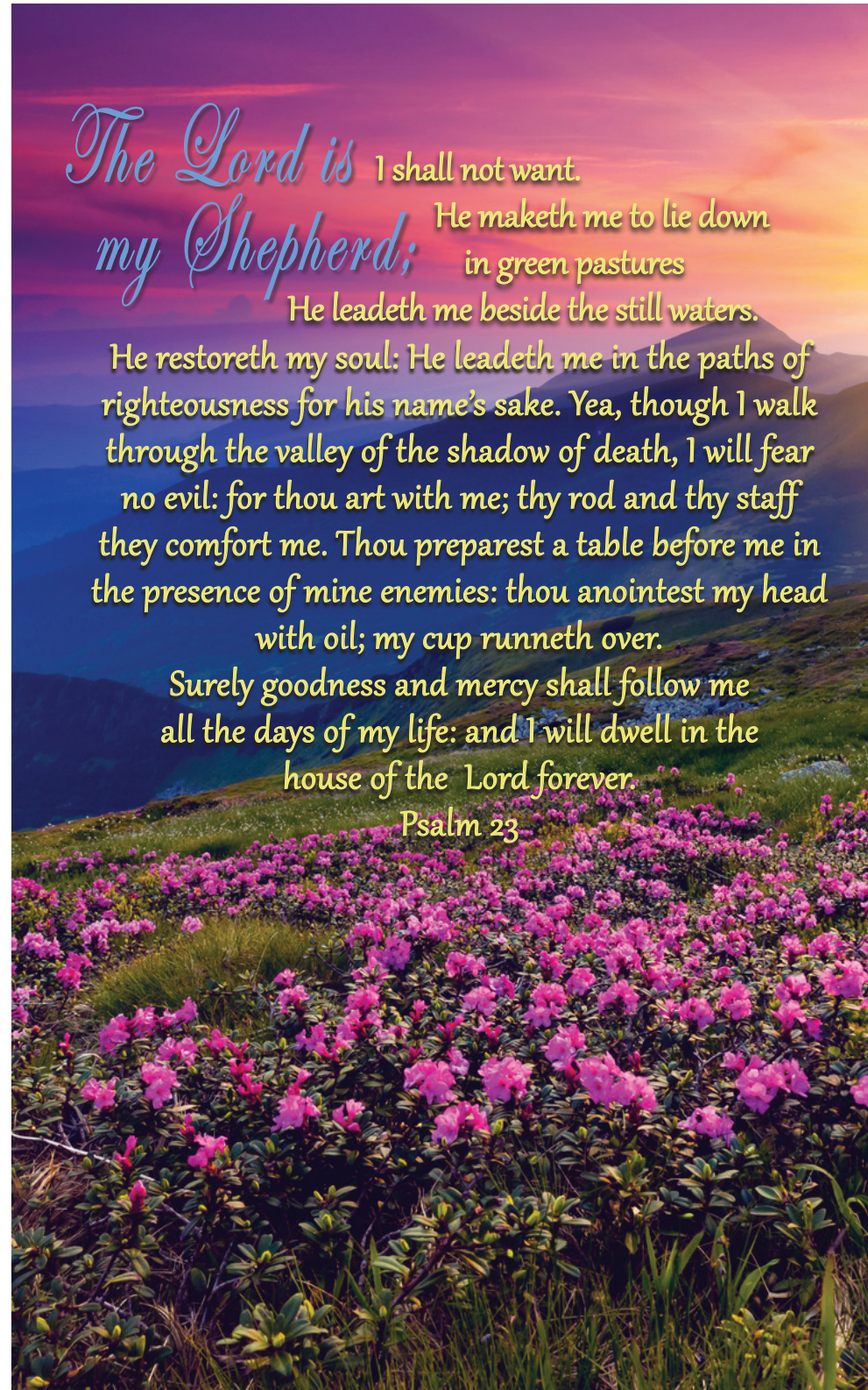


The Lord is I shall not want.
