



A Celebration of Life Donald E. Bruner

Donald Eugene Bruner, son of Ralph Eugene and Donna Sue (Byrd) Bruner, was born May 9, 1965, in Columbia, MO. He was the youngest of four sons born to the Bruner family. He spent his younger years in Missouri but when Donald was in the fourth grade, the family relocated to McPherson, Kansas where Donald attended the local schools. He made friends easily and had a magnetic personality that attracted people to him. He was well thought of by his classmates and had a circle of friends that encompassed people from all walks of life.

He graduated from McPherson High School in the class of 1983. During his school days, Donald was very active in extracurricular activities; participating in football, wrestling, and track & field. He also loved music, played the piano, and was a standout for his singing in concert choir and mixed ensemble. Following high school graduation, Don went off to Bethany College (Lindsborg, KS) where he later graduated in 1987 with a degree in music.

Donald had been a Salina resident for many years and had a long career as a supervisor with Tony's Pizza and Schwann's Home Delivery.

Not long after college, Donald began to struggle with various health issues and at age 37, he began dialysis treatments. He also had a heart attack, and it seemed that the health problems facing him were insurmountable. Through it all, Donald's faith in God helped him face many difficult

situations and, in spite of it all, he always maintained a positive attitude and had a smile that would light up the room. His family was a tremendous support to him in the best and worst of times, and he cherished his relationship with each and every one of them.

After a brief time under hospice care, Donald passed away peacefully on Wednesday, September 21, 2022, surrounded by family at the Holiday Resort Health & Rehab, Salina. He was fifty-seven.
