Kenneth "Ken" Henneberg went home to his Lord and Savior on April 2, 2023, in Queen Creek, AZ, at age 84.

Kenneth Floyd Henneberg was known as a husband, father, grandfather, uncle, Veteran, faithful Christian, enthusiastic gardener, and retired inventory control manager to those who knew or loved him.

Ken was born on November 23, 1938, in Odessa, MN, the youngest of eight. He graduated from Odessa High School in 1958. After 24 years of growing up on the family farm where he was born, Ken enlisted in the US Army in 1962. He was stationed in Fort Huachuca for two years. He was baptized and confirmed at Trinity Evangelical Lutheran Church in Odessa, MN.

Ken and Kari were married in St. Paul, MN, at St. Mary's Episcopal Church, on October 10, 1964.

Ken was a loyal Goodin Co. Inc. employee for 37 ½ years as the inventory control manager in Minneapolis. Recognized for his hard work he was awarded a Caribbean cruise vacation.

Ken and Kari retired in 2000 and later found a new adventure in Florence, AZ. They joined a newly formed church, Christ the Victor, and began creating connections. Ken was active on the food shelf and served as usher and deacon. Ken loved gardening, sightseeing, and RVing with his family.

Ken is survived by his wife of 59 years, Karen "Kari" Lee (Gold); son, Allen (Paula); daughter, Andrea (Spencer) Scofield; grandson, Isaac; and granddaughter, Natalie.
