- Flashlight & batteries
- Bathing suit

Recommended but not required:

Items Prohibited (Do NOT bring these items):

- TV, VCR/DVD/Blu-ray player
- Media containing explicit lyrics or content
- Hot plate
- Electric grill
- Cook top
- Space heater
- Popcorn popper
- Halogen lamps
- Pets
- Candles, matches, lighters, Incense, fireworks

- Alcohol or alcohol containers
- Tobacco
- Drugs or drug paraphernalia
- Weapons of any kind (including but not limited to: firearms, ammunition, knives, etc.)
- Power tools
- Iron
- Electric blanket
