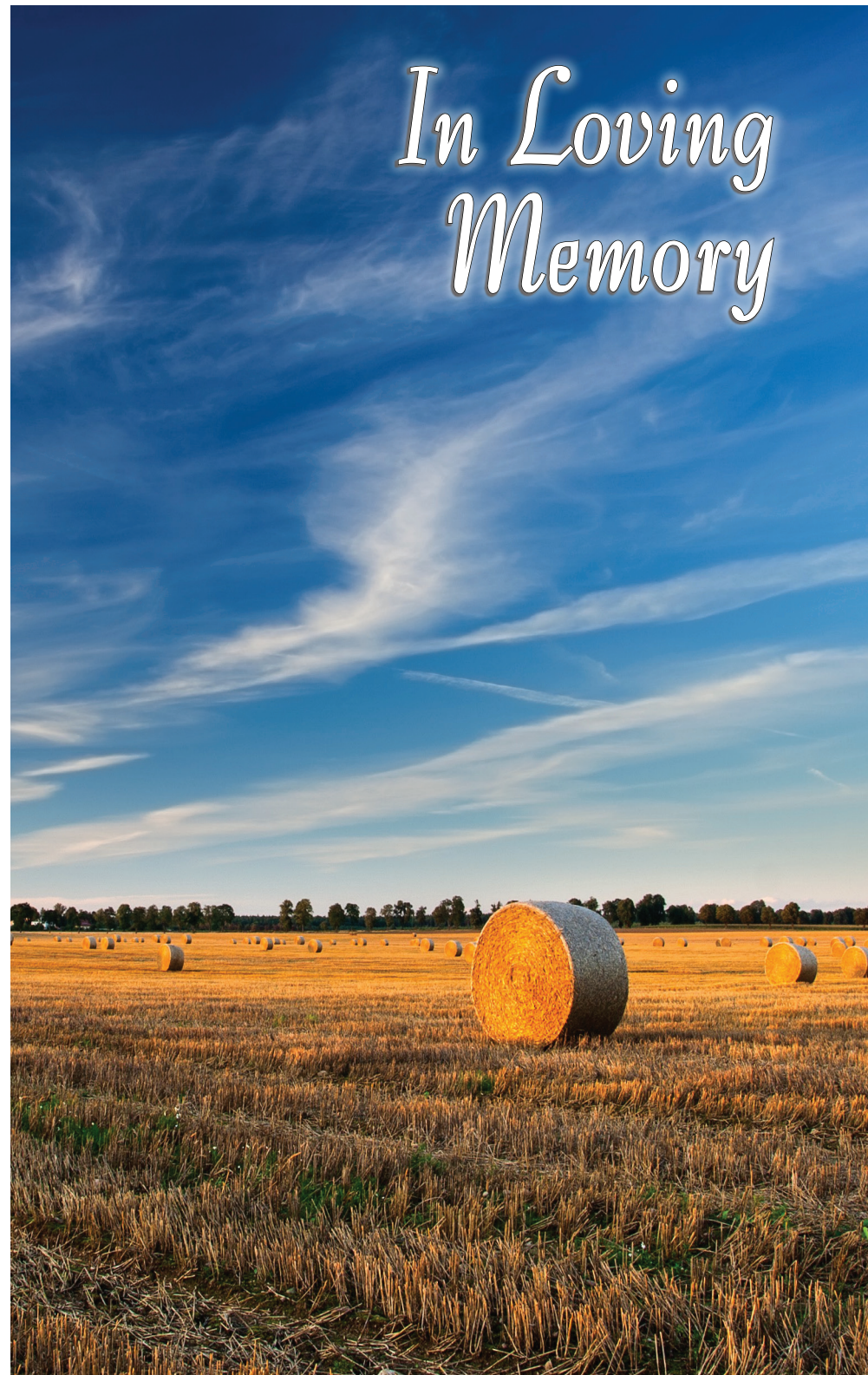


*For those I love, for those who love me,
