Lois Jean Fox, known as “Elg” to those who loved her, passed peacefully at the age of 86 on Tuesday morning, December 20, 2022 in Mt. Pleasant. She was born September 4, 1936 in Richfield to J.D. and Estella Anderson Sandberg. She spent the last 35 years of her life living in Mayfield, Utah with her loving husband of 57 years. She loved Halloween and movie musicals, instilling the love of both in her son and granddaughter (with grudging acceptance from her husband).

She had a lifelong compassion for animals and often found herself taking in strays others had abandoned, giving them the care they needed, and a warm, safe place to call home.
