





Melvin quit school to pursue his dream of joining the United States Army. He valiantly served in the Vietnam War for four years, and served an additional three years in the Army Reserves once returning home. Melvin was proud of his work in the Army and considered it an honor to serve his country.

He worked in the maintenance department at various textile mills for the majority of his life. Through the Business Enterprise Program of Georgia, which facilitates blind vendors the opportunity to operate food service vending operations, Melvin and Deborah served at various technical schools in Valdosta and Augusta, and lastly at the Lavonia Welcome Center.

A jack of all trades, he proudly built two homes that his family lived in. Not only did Melvin physically construct the homes he, along with Deborah, built a foundation of love, honesty, and integrity that their large family has grown upon. He used his love of woodworking and construction abilities to remodel various different properties for himself and friends.

Melvin had a variety of hobbies, but was especially fond of motorcycle riding and camping. He always enjoyed being outside, gardening, and was his family's biggest cheerleader. Our "Pop" and "Papa" had a heart of gold, was always willing help anyone in need, and took care of us all. He was truly was our hero.
