Below is a digest of the Mission Prayer Meeting last Sunday and is intended to be a guide for others in DBC to join with us in supporting our partners overseas. Thank you for doing so. We opened by reciting Psalm 113 together.

The Church in Aksakovo, Bulgaria. (we have a very special link with this church). We prayed for Ventzi's family, as they had been through an 'emotional' time in the last month: we thanked God for an improvement in the condition of Jenya's father, but continued to pray for Ventzi's father-in-law for a compete healing and for his spiritual awakening. We prayed for the impact of their Christmas services.

R and S in the Far East

We prayed for S's ongoing contacts with those suffering from SSA, that he would have great wisdom in counselling them; for Josiah as he faces difficult questioning at school about the family.

We prayed for R that she would have inspiration in designing lectures at the college, and that she will recover well from all the extra lessons that were required of her on successive Saturdays. Also, that the family would be able to invite more of their friends on future Saturdays.

R and J serving Central Asia

We prayed for the family, with their challenging work with the apps, website etc, and for Elodie and Ethan at university. For energy for J and R, and for blessing over the Christmas period.

Julia in South Africa

We prayed for Julia, for her ongoing work with disabled children, and for her decision on how long to remain in the country; for her frustration over electricity load-shedding up to 4 hours a day; and for her medical concerns, particularly that she would soon receive the results of her CT scan.
