

Fisherman's Prayer

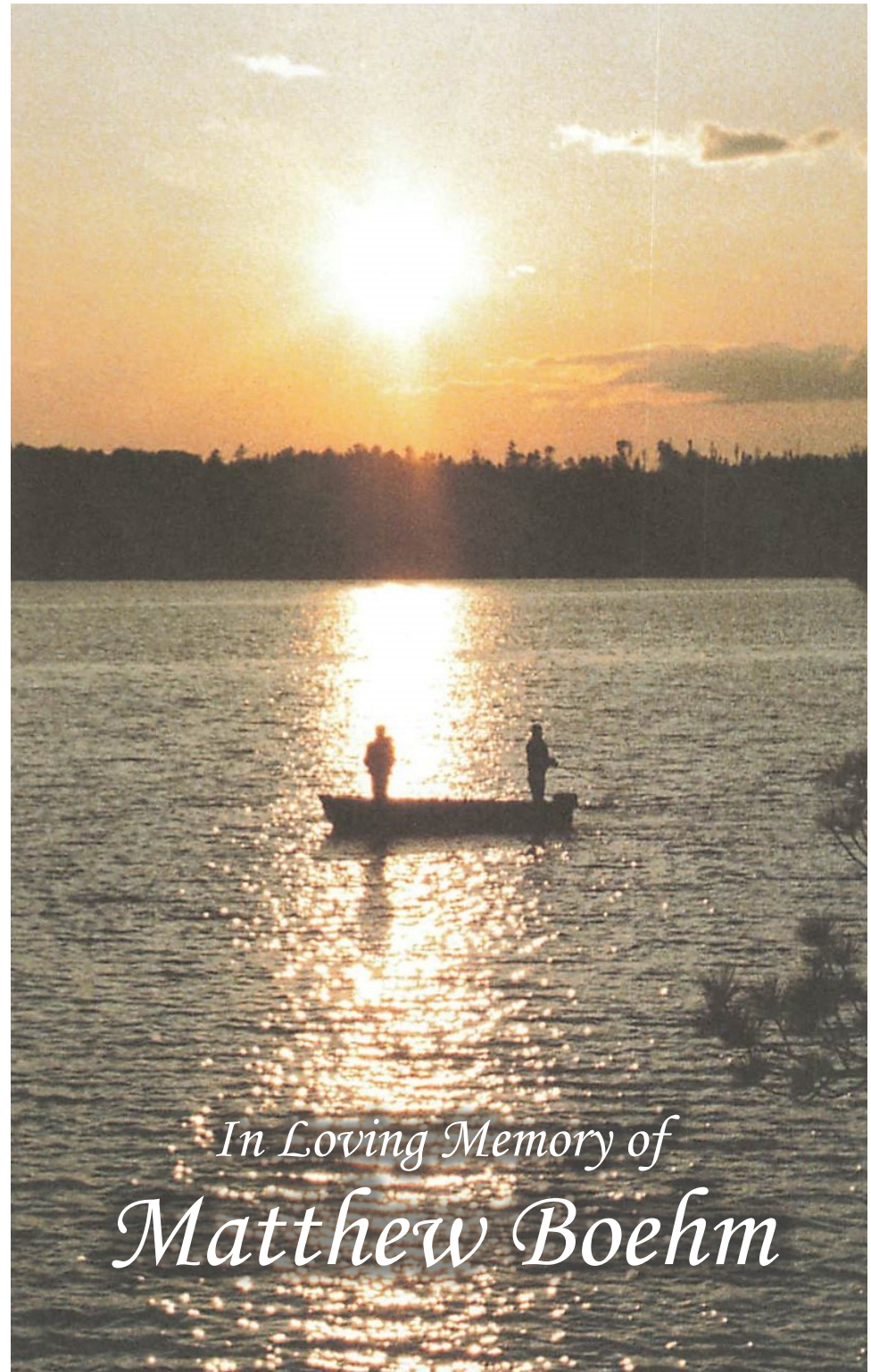
*God grant that I may live to
