

When Tomorrow Starts Without Me

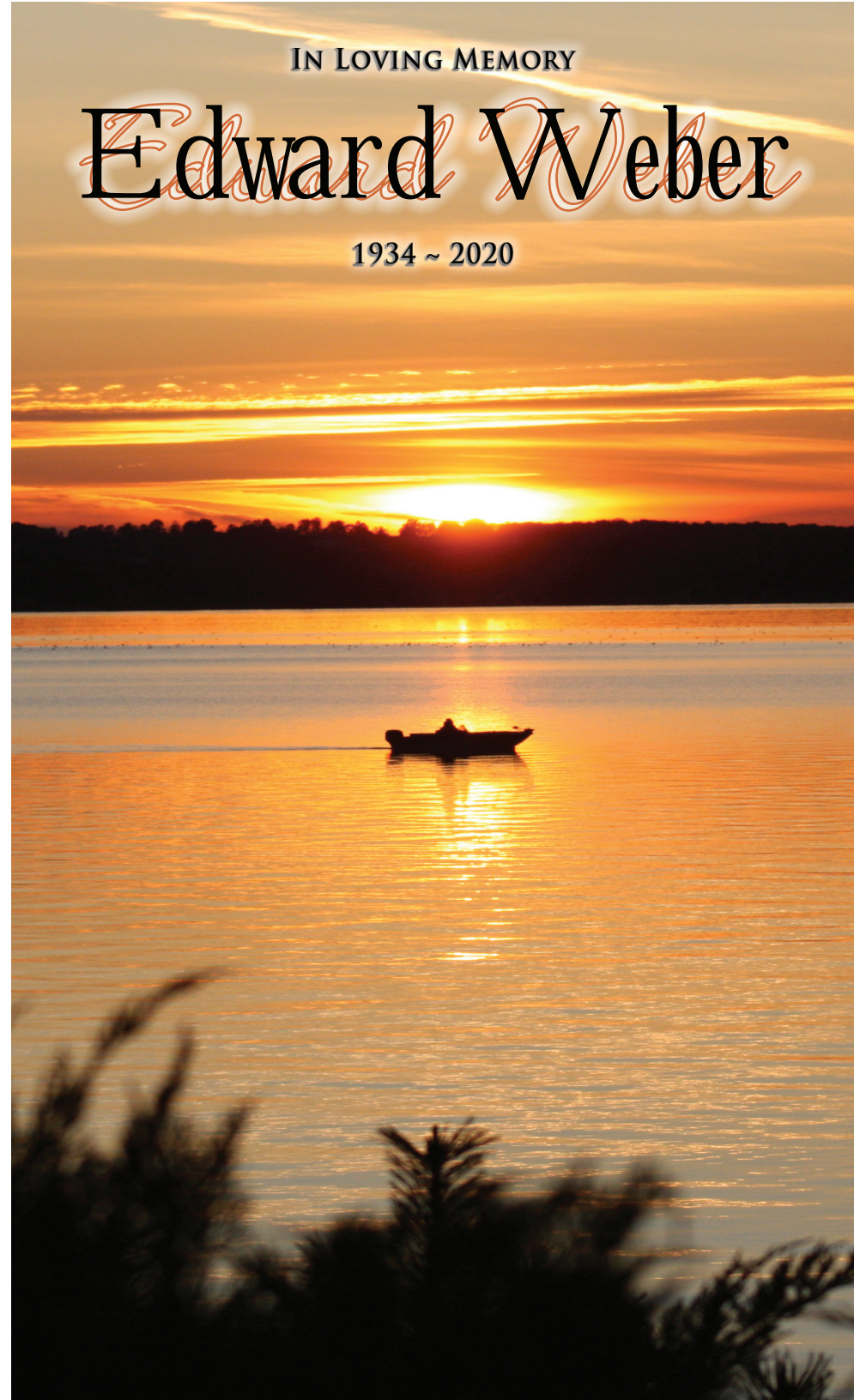
WHEN TOMORROW STARTS WITHOUT ME
