Dorothy LaPrecia Clark was born June 22, 1940 in Omaha, Nebraska to Chrisman Clark and Dorothy Clark. Dorothy affectionately was known to all as Dottie or Ms. D.C. Dottie attended Portland High School in Portland, Maine as a freshman and sophomore. The family relocated to Washington, D.C. where she completed high school at Calvin Coolidge in 1958 and was to attend her 65th class reunion in September of 2023. She attended college in D.C., originally, Minors Teachers College which later became Federal City College, now known as University of the District of Columbia (UDC). Dottie's proudest degree, which she excelled exceptionally well at, and graduated in the very top of that class, was her Thrift, Estate & Yard Sale Shoppers Degree, in which she earned double Phd. and three-time Masters Degrees. That was her happy place finding treasures.

Dottie was a member of the Brownie and Girl Scout Troup #63 in Portland, Maine. Dottie competed in Ms. Coast Guard becoming a finalist and the first black winner. Dottie was one of the founding members of the very active D.C. social club called The Sophisti - "Kitts" Inc. A group of girlfriends which had many events, including fancy cabarets, dances and annually raffling off season tickets to the Redskin's football games. As a federal government employee for her entire working career she retired after 30 years of service. While In the government she worked at the Department of Labor and advanced her career to a political appointee for the Secretary of Education, Joseph W. Leighton, and later retired from the Department Education.

Dottie's hobbies were reading, dancing (oh how she loved to dance!!), lunch and dinners with friends, traveling, shopping and as we all know again, Thrift Shopping! Dottie chose to never marry because she was independent and wanted to move in her own directions. Never having children, she was the best aunt to Angie Parks; Joettee Reid; Virgil Parks; Marquitta Murrell; Mark & Cameron Lyons. A loving and caring great aunt to Idris and Darrell Murrell; Camreon Lyons and Kameron Lyons to whom she would travel to Omaha every summer to spend time with them when they summer vacationed here in Omaha .

Dottie was preceded in death by her Grand parents, Albin & Leela Simmons, father, Chrisman Clark, mother, Dorothy (Stevens/Clark) Murrell, sisters Peggy Jean Clark and Carolyn (Clark) Lofton, niece Angela Parks (Angie B) and Kendall Parks.

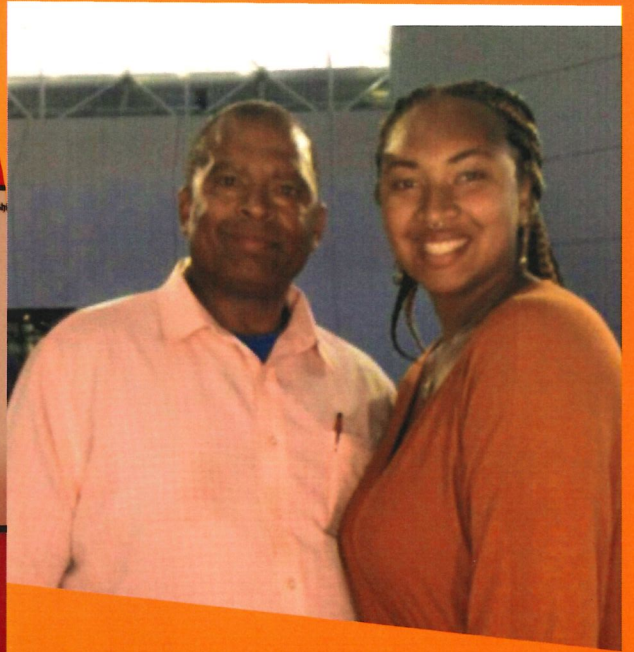
