Growing up, Jesse was raised in the Baptist Church. He then converted to the Nation of Islam and found interest in the Black Panther Party for Self-Defense.

Jesse was a Jack-of-All-Trades, but he will be most remembered in the Denver Community for his Jazzy Ripped Jeans, planning, and producing fashion shows, and as Jazzy the Rose Man! His smile and debonair personality brightened every room he stepped foot in.

One evening at Club Mix, while "working his charm," Jesse handed a rose to Pichell Lawrence. They fell in love and vowed to spend the rest of their lives together in 2001. Jesse was the proud father of Precious, Jesse "Jazzy" Jr., Quinton, Katina, and Subrina. As children, they fondly remember their dad taking them to the movies, especially to see Michael Jackson's *This Is It*, and countless fashion shows. Jesse lived for family functions and loved attending Quinton's wedding and his granddaughter's baby shower.

Jesse was a family man who enjoyed reading, writing, designing, MC'ing, going to clubs, and making people happy. His best friends, George, DJ Unanimous, and Terry (his birthday twin), will always remember his kind spirit that made everyone feel worthy, warm, and welcomed.

Jesse departed this life on November 8, 2021.
