

December 11, 1940 ~ October 10, 2024



Delmar Dean Huber, son of Jonah George and Lucille Allen (Kerbs) Huber, was born on December 11, 1940, in Hillsboro, KS. He was one of four children born to the Huber family. Delmar spent his younger years in the Durham-Hillsboro area before moving to McPherson.

On November 26, 1960, Delmar was united in marriage to Gladys "Glady" Illene Winn at the First United Methodist Church in McPherson. This union was blessed with the birth of three children; Dawna, Dallas, and Darci. Delmar and Glady were married for 62 years prior to her passing on January 8, 2023.

Delmar was a crew chief at Board of Public Utilities, retiring in 2005. He worked for BPU a total of 42 years and it was obvious that he loved his job and had the reputation of being a dedicated worker.

Delmar and Glady were nearly inseparable. They loved to go camping, boating, and fishing at Marion Reservoir,
