Her family will always cherish her beautiful quilts and afghans which she made until her failing eyesight and arthritic hands prevented her from continuing. She also enjoyed gardening in the summer and watching the MN Twins. Her family will always miss her chocolate-covered cherries at Christmas.

She is survived by son Thomas (Joan) of West Fargo, daughters Shirley (Jerome) Spry of Callaway, Geraldine (Harold) Askelson of Detroit Lakes, 14 grandchildren, 36 great-grandchildren, 10 great-grandchildren.

Her husband, parents, sisters, brother, granddaughter Susan and great-grandson Tanner preceded her in death.
