Our special focus this month is on autism, which we wish to mark by acknowledging **Autism Acceptance Week** which runs from 27 March - 2 April 2023.

Autism Spectrum Condition (ASC) is caused by differences in the brain. Scientists believe there are multiple causes that act together to change the most common ways people develop. The condition can affect a person's social skills, such as communication and the way they interact with other people.

It is estimated that there are around 700,000 Autistic people in the UK. The aim of Autism Acceptance Week is to help more people understand what autism is, as well as the ways it can affect life for Autistic people.

Mass at 11am on Sunday, 2nd April will include a special focus to mark the conclusion of Autism Acceptance Week.

Our grateful thanks to Marion Hodder's friend, Julie, who has kindly prepared for our Parish the following insight into her experience raising her beloved autistic son.

Julie writes

"I'd like to begin by explaining that my son came to live with us at the age of 5 as a foster child so my experiences may differ from those of a birth mother.

Being a child/young adult with autism is, no doubt, a challenge, but living with a child/young person with autism is a challenge for all the family too. There are the fundamental challenges of the young person's needs. For example, my son was very late in developing spoken language and therefore, we supported his communication using Makaton* sign language and he soon became far more proficient at this than the rest of us!

There were challenges around his behaviour. He could be physically aggressive towards others and particularly his brother by slapping, biting and headbutting. His brother was, and continues to be totally understanding, tolerant, loving and his best friend. The bond they share is deeper than any other relationship in their lives.

Sensory issues can be a major hurdle for some children with autism. Having their hair or nails cut can actually be painful, but also, we have to be mindful of the language we use around such activities. People with autism can be very literal. If we say, "we are going to cut your hair" the autistic person may relate being "cut" with being hurt! We preferred to say, "we are going to trim your nails or your hair".

For me, being a parent of a child with autism has been an education.

You learn how to fight harder than you ever had to do for

your other children. You learn to accept your child/young person for who they are. You learn to pick your battles with them and celebrate the victories and their successes and try to educate the wider society to do the same. You learn not to give up.

We were told, when our son was 5 years old, by a child psychologist, "he will never amount to anything, he will never socialise or make friends, you will never be able to take him to a restaurant".

Well, 25 years on we have a man who loves nothing better than spending time with his family. He enjoys regular holidays to Greece where he has a huge friendship circle. He lives in a supported living house and is doing very well. As for friends, he just celebrated his 30th birthday with a party with 80 guests!

Most of all you learn to love and be loved unconditionally.

It's been a long, tough road, but I am so proud of the man my son has become. He has overcome so much in his life and still faces challenges ahead, but he has all his family and his friends beside him.



The running time is 127 minutes.

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

Liturgy Pillar

April is a busy month for all those involved in liturgy at St James, as we approach Holy Week, with the culmination of the Triduum and the Easter Sunday Celebrations. Preparations are already underway, and I thank all those who are participating in someway for their dedication and time to the parish. Stations of the cross continue to take place every Sunday afternoon, and then we have a number of services coming up to highlight.

On Monday 3rd April at 7pm there is Lenten Reconciliation Service, a time for reflection and to receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation before Easter.

On Thursday 6th April at 7pm we begin the Triduum with the Mass of the Last Supper including the washing of the feet.

On Good Friday there is a children's station of the cross at 10:00am, and the Petts Wood Walk of Witness at 11am. At 3pm we have the Good Friday Service. In the evening at 7:30pm we have time for prayer and reflection with music from the Taizé community.

On Holy Saturday at 11:30am there is the blessing of the Polish Easter baskets (all welcome to see and smell this beautiful tradition), and at 8pm we have the Easter Vigil including an adult Baptism and Confirmation.

Finally, on Easter Sunday we have the 9:15 and the 11am Masses, with an Easter Egg Hunt following the 9:15.

We hope to see as many of you attend and experience these beautiful services.

As you can imagine, planning such events includes a lot of people – and I would like to introduce you to two people involved in the liturgy teams in the parish to explain what they do, and why they do it.

First up we have Tricia – who is one of our Sacristans:

Hello! My name is Tricia Willard, and I am one of Father David's Sacristans.

I was first invited by Father David to be one of his Sacristans about 6 years ago. It is a ministry that I dearly love and will be forever grateful to Father David for giving me this beautiful opportunity to be of service to him and to God!

There are 5 Sacristans who cover the 7 weekly masses and also funeral masses, and also preparing for Adoration on the first Friday of the month. We also cover for each other during holidays etc, and work as a team!

On Mondays, I open the church at 8.30am and clean the Sanctuary and the Sacristy before preparing for Mass. Preparation for Mass consists of, making sure the Chalice and vessels are thoroughly cleaned, and putting the Hosts and water and wine on the credence table, putting on the lights, and the music to make the church welcoming for parishioners. Different coloured vestments are worn on different days, so the Tabernacle curtain is changed accordingly, and the daily readings and Gospel are set out. Just before Mass begins, the altar candles are lit. The candles on our Ladies Altar are lit, and the memorial book is turned to the correct page for that day.

On Saturdays I open the church at 4.30pm to prepare for Confessions at 5pm, again making sure the Church is welcoming for parishioners, and then preparing for Vigil Mass. The routine is slightly different for weekend Masses, as we have an offertory at the back of the church to allow parishioners to have an active role in the Masses!

Once Masses have finished, everything is put back into the Sacristy, the music and lights are turned off and the church is locked up.

I also help Breda and Goeff when there is a Baptism, which is usually on a Sunday afternoon, and is a delight to be part of!

I also make sure that Father David and Bishop Pat's vestments are regularly cleaned, and I share with Breda, the cleaning of the purificators which Father David uses to purify the Chalice after communion.

Sacristans also keep an eye on the Hosts and Communion Wine making sure that we always have enough in stock. We keep an eye on the votive candles too, and let Suzanne or Caroline know if we are running low.

I love my role as Sacristan, thank you Father David!

I would also like to introduce you to Tanya, who is part of the 9:15 music ministry team:

Hello St James' Parishioners, I'm Tanya Cardoza and have been a parishioner here for 5 years and those who know me, have probably seen me in the 9.15 choir, which I gravitated to almost immediately on joining this parish. Music, especially through singing, has been a part of my life for as long as I can remember. As long as you could carry a tune, most children were encouraged to join the children's choir in church, and soon I became a cantor at the 07.30am daily mass. However, it was about 25 years ago as a youth that I truly found my place in the music ministry. The realisation that my voice was a gift that could be taken away anytime, thus must be shared. The involvement meant the majority of our social circle surrounded the church and the music opportunities, and thus was a secure place during my formative years. It also brought immense exposure through invitations to join other amateur choirs, musical theatre etc. Over the years, the feedback that I was able to touch someone's heart encouraged me more.

I don't really read music and rely heavily on my ear but that's a result of the resources available at the time and you evolved around that. I love the contemporary Praise and worship hymns for their tunes are catchy and lyrics are always so relatable. You can always find one to fit your mood. If you can't, I'd be happy to suggest a few.

If I am singing, I feel I belong! And that feeling draws me back every time. There is nothing I'd rather do.

I thank them both for their time and their gifts and talents and look forward to introducing more of the liturgy team in the future. I would like to take this opportunity to wish you all a blessed, prayerful and joyful Easter.



The Reading Ministry During Church Services

There are many people in our Parish and in our worldwide church who share the privilege of reading at Mass.

Those who read in our Parish say it is a humbling Ministry : knowing that you are helping to share the Word of God ; That it enables the chance to prepare for the reading in advance and to reflect on its meaning and what it means in our lives today. For some it has encouraged them to do further reading around a text, which may otherwise not have happened.

It is an important ministry, because it is through human language that people hear the Good News of Jesus Christ. Before the reader begins reading a scriptural text, the words are merely ink on paper. These words, however, become the life-giving words of The Holy Scripture, for the people listening, when they are spoken by the reader. This is the fundamental task of our church reader : to bring life to the Word of God contained in Holy Scripture. Through the voice of the reader we have the opportunity to better encounter the Word of God

There is richness in the variety of readings read during different Church services. They employ various literary forms to convey the message of salvation, ranging from narratives, the poetry of the psalms, prophetic oracles and parables, theological expositions and apocalyptic visions. A reader proclaims the word of the Lord through an awareness of the literary form of a particular reading or psalm, and through the use of expression and voice, helps the listener to better experience and reflect on THE WORDS.

Readers had a fantastic workshop led by Jennifer Sims in February. Her drama and Education background helped us to think about different techniques to bring richness to our reading. Emphasis on words; thinking about the meaning; pausing at appropriate places; to look up if possible and speak to the church congregation, as well as the live-stream congregation. Great thanks to Jennifer for her time and knowledge, in making the session fun and interactive.

If you would like to read at the St James' Church services , you would be most welcome and it is a rewarding Ministry to be involved in.

<u>Dementia Awareness Week</u> runs from 16 - 22 May. This month, to mark this special time of focus we are providing information & signposting links to sources offering vital support to those affected by this disease.

What is dementia?

Dementia is an umbrella term for a range of progressive conditions targeting the brain which, over time, can affect a person's memory, problem-solving ability, language & behaviour. While there are over 200 subtypes of dementia, the most common are Alzheimer's Disease & Vascular dementia. The other three main types are Lewy Bodies, Frontotemporal,& Mixed Dementia.

Ahead of cancer, cardiovascular disease and stroke, dementia is one of the main causes of disability in later life. Sadly the condition has become commonplace in society today but with medical research & improved communication, the illness is now looked upon with greater understanding & compassion than it was previously.

According to the Alzheimer's Society it is expected that some 210,000 people in the UK will develop dementia in 2023 & this number is projected to rise to 1.6 million by 2040. Worldwide it is estimated that 55 million people are living with dementia. This is predicted to rise to 139 million by 2050.

A crucial part of the Alzheimer Society's work is advocating for & funding research into dementia.Recently they welcomed the news in the Spring Budget, that the Government has pledged to reform how the UK regulates medicines and medical technology.

Although sadly not yet available in the UK, there has been very promising news about trials of the drug Lecanemab which has shown to slow down the changes in thought processes & memory loss.

From 2024, the agency which approves drugs for use in the UK will have the potential to make new treatments accessible more quickly through rapid sign off for medicines and technology that have already been approved by trusted regulators around the world.

This positive step needs to come hand-in-hand with an urgency to prepare the NHS for such treatments and to accelerate improvements in dementia diagnosis. Campaigning for this is now one of the Society's top priorities & during Dementia Action Week, they will be hosting an event in Parliament talking to decision-makers about dementia diagnosis & stressing that *"dementia isn't getting old, it's getting ill."*

Our <u>11am Mass on Sunday, 14 May</u> will offer a special opportunity for us to come together in unity & empathy to think of all those whose lives are affected by dementia - those living with the disease, their carers & their families,

especially in our Parish. Let us keep them closely in our prayers.

St Dymphna, whose Feast Day falls on 15 May, is recognised as the patroness of those affected by all forms of dementia.. The following is a traditional prayer asking for her intercession and for Our Lord's help. "Gentle St. Dymphna, patron of those with illnesses affecting the mind, be my intercessor to Jesus, the Divine Physician. In the face of loss of memory and control, increase my confidence in God's providence. In the midst of confusion and isolation, remind me of God's enduring peace and presence. Obtain for me courage and strength to accept these trials from the loving hand of God with patience; He knows what is best for the salvation of my soul. I offer this illness to God, for His glory and the salvation of souls, especially my own. Amen."

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Parish Overseas Project Update & Appeal Supporting the Divine Providence Hospital, El Salvador

In collaboration with Archbishop Romero Trust

The JPIC group continue to work closely with the Archbishop Romero Trust on the Parish Overseas Project to support the Divine Providence Hospital in El Salvador, which provides palliative care to the community in San Salvador. During the month of February 2023, Archbishop John Wilson visited the hospital in El Salvador which is managed by Sisters of the Carmelite Community. During the visit Archbishop John was updated by the Chair of Romero Trust on the project and the support provided by our Parish in funding the procurement of an equipment sterilisation unit (Autoclave) and further support to contribute towards other requirements including installation of Solar panels to support reduction in energy bills and use of solar energy. 

Dear Parishioners, I am Angela Murray, and it is my pleasure to write this note by way of introducing our flower arranging team at St James. Our team members are Shelene Smith, Joanne Robinson, Lesley Matthews, Helen Morgan and Angela Evans.





Liturgy Pillar

I would like to begin by mentioning Bridie Duck who as a long-standing parishioner started flower arranging in approximately 1970. Over time her sister and Betty Evans joined her. I first met Bridie on a parishioner Pilgrimage to Lourdes in 2007 where I discovered she needed help at St James (I was arranging flowers elsewhere) so joined Bridie in 2008. Because of Covid, Bridie retired after some 50 years. I still seek her advice. On behalf of St. James and our flower team we THANK her for her long-standing dedication.

During Covid/Lockdown with the help of my family we were able to continue obtaining and arrange flowers for the Sanctuary. The arrangements for Holy Days etc., involves much planning. We browse through previous photos to decide what to order from the wholesalers. Timing for collecting the flowers is critical to ensure that they are "ready". Occasionally at home we place them in warm water and we also place them near a radiator to encourage their opening. On getting them to church we condition them by trimming and stripping away any unwanted greenery from the stems. They are then sorted and placed in buckets, named ready for the next day.

For Easter 2023 there were eight buckets, plus lots of greenery from our gardens and neighbours living nearby. If I'm short of greenery I knock on strangers' doors and ask if I can have some of theirs. I always get a good response "Yes, help yourself", so they get an Easter/Christmas card thanking them!!.

The order of the day is to prepare the dishes and pedestals and set them up in their positions and arranging them. As a team we enjoy helping each other, along with friendly chats. We never forget our mugs for the coffee breaks! We also pop in twice a week to water as these big arrangements drink a lot!!

We currently have two members belonging to The Guild of Church Flower arrangers, Orpington Floral Art Society and the Phoenix Flower Club. I flower arrange at Southwark Cathedral near London Bridge once a month. We all enjoy doing the flowers and hope they enhance your experience when you are in church. We thank Fr. David for allowing us a free rein to do what we think best throughout the year.

We also say the Church Flower Arrangers Prayer:

"May God grant that our hearts, our eyes and our hands may receive His inspiration enabling us to glorify His house with the beauty of the leaves and blossoms which He has created. Amen."

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Dementia Updates

We mentioned last month that The Alzheimer's Society was building a base of evidence to ensure their calls to improve dementia diagnoses were the right ones. They have now published a report on their findings, which contains evidence & recommendations for healthcare decision makers & commissioners to enact. Their 17 page Report "Improving Access to a Timely and Accurate Diagnosis of Dementia in England, Wales and Northern Ireland" can be downloaded using the following link. https://www.alzheimers.org.uk/about-us/policy-andinfluencing/improving-access-timely-accurate-diagnosisdementia-england-wales-northern-ireland

Government Benefits for People Living with Dementia

Many people living with dementia could be eligible to claim Attendance Allowance depending on their needs. Attendance Allowance is a tax-free noncontributory benefit payable to people of state pension age and over who have needed help with their personal care for six months prior to the date of the claim. If the application is successful, they may also be eligible for a reduction in their Council Tax.

In August 2019 the criteria for Blue Badge applications changed to include people living with dementia. A successful application would be dependent on the person's mobility, perception and several other factors. Carers of those living with dementia could be eligible to claim Carers Allowance depending on their age and circumstances. More information can be found on www.gov.uk then select the search button for the subject you wish to research.

The claim forms for these benefits, particularly Attendance Allowance, are lengthy & very detailed. If you require some help or advice in completing any of the above application forms, please contact the Parish Office who can signpost you to someone who has experience of these forms.

If any parishioners already have a votive candle or candles from a previous Service, please bring it/ them with you & we will happily provide you with new candle inserts if required.

In the July Newsletter we will be including information about external sources of support (also signposted on our Board in the Church Porch).

It promises to be a very informative session about the Bible.

Nick's Testimony From Protestantism: A journey to St James

I couldn't script this. I keep saying that it's been such a surprise and so unlikely. Anecdotally, it's also quite amusing remembering the first Bible I received as a young Christian aged 8 was Catholic – "Good News Bible with Deuteronicals and Apocrypha".

In some serendipitous way I've come full circle, both spiritually and geographically – from those days of my mother's spiritual fostering in Pentecostal Protestantism, to being baptised Catholic, while uprooting myself from the mother city of Cape Town, South Africa to the land of my father's birth in Kentish England.

Seeking a spiritual community

As a young family, we've been seeking a spiritual home for over 4yrs now. Initially, we didn't attend church because we (for good or for bad) felt we needed to use Sunday as a day for rest and recovery – trying to acclimatise as immigrants after the stress of selling a business and relocating to this great city. We also didn't know where to go, as we had come from a church community that we invested many years of our life into. We were also convinced that we wouldn't find anything quite like it and were left a bit frozen at the idea of what to do next.

Experiencing Journey in Faith at St James

Fast forward to early July last year - we began to visit St James as a family. One morning Fr. David made a pitch for people to join the Journey in Faith course, and I signed up out of interest. Beginning with the much familiar Alpha course (We had run this before in South Africa), it then moved on to a more Catholic chronology beginning with an overview of the Bible into a study of The Sacraments. As I write, we are spending the last few sessions working on core Catholic teachings. The class this year is diverse, friendly and engaged – it's been nice to make new friends in the process.

From propositions to participation

It has been a wonderfully enriching experience into a Catholic perspective propositionally through study, and procedurally through practises of liturgy, litany and prayer. Eventually, this culminated in the joy of participating in the rite of election at Southwark Cathedral and then into the climax of baptism – together with my two children (Isabelle -8 and Sebastian -4) at the Easter vigil. Seeing the faith development in our kids culminating in this Easter vigil was a big moment in time and so fulfilling to see as parents. The event also enabled those outside of St James to participate in the experience. My unbelieving in-laws and my Christian friends came to our baptism, and this has resulted in some interesting conversations with all.

In conclusion

We are delighted to have found a spiritual home among the people of St James. Honestly, it's been quite a transformative roller coaster ride for us: we have the joy at weekly Sunday mass to worship and pray together as a family (which I feel is quite a rare Christian experience). I now have a godfather, my kids have godparents, we are learning about the saints, and my wife and I often talk about the new things we find in this new Catholic experience – all in all it has made our Christian experience feel quite enchanted, and we are all better off for it!

A Repair Café has been operational in Petts Wood at St Francis of Assisi Church Hall, Greencourt Road, Petts Wood, BR5 1QW.

Saturdays: 24 June, 22 July, 2 September, 21 October, and 18 November from 2.00 – 4.30pm

People visiting the Repair Cafe can bring along their broken items: toasters, lamps, hairdryers, clothes, bikes, toys, furniture - anything broken is welcome. They'll sit with the volunteer experts as the item is repaired, maybe picking up the skills to fix it next time. There will be a donation's box so people can donate what they feel the repair is worth to them/they can afford.

St Francis' Church looks forward to welcoming people to the café where, in addition to getting an item repaired, they can enjoy a slice of homemade cake and a hot drink.

New National Shrine of St Oscar Romero

The Archdiocese of have announced that the Diocesan Shrine of St Oscar Romero at St George's Cathedral, Southwark, has been elevated to the status of a National Shrine for England and Wales.

Following a petition to the Catholic Bishops' Conference of England and Wales by the Archbishop of Southwark, Archbishop John Wilson, the Bishops gave their unanimous approval to the new National Shrine at their recent Spring Plenary Meeting in Leeds.

St Oscar Romero (b. 1917) was Archbishop of San Salvador in El Salvador from February 1977 until his assassination and martyrdom on 24 March 1980. He was an outspoken advocate of the Gospel and the teaching of the Catholic Church in defence of justice and peace, human rights and the protection of the poor. He was canonised by Pope Francis on 14 October 2018.

The Romero Shrine in St George's Cathedral was explicitly recognised as a Diocesan Shrine in 2019, through the promulgation of Statutes. There is a growing appreciation of Romero in the UK, including through the work of the Romero Trust and the Romero Award (for schools), and also ecumenically.

Overseas Project associated with a 21st Century Saint and role model in living our Catholic values. The project includes helping the Divine Providence Hospital in San Salvador with procurement of an equipment sterilisation unit and to support other requirements including installation of Solar panels. St Oscar lived at the hospital grounds and was killed there while celebrating mass.



Our Patron Saint: St James the Great



With the feast of our patron saint being on July 25th, it is appropriate to include in this edition, the history of St James the Great.

St James the Great, also known as James the son of Zebedee, was one of the twelve apostles of Jesus Christ. He was the brother of John the Apostle, and both were known as the "Sons of Thunder" for their fiery and zealous personalities. James is revered as a saint in both the Catholic and Orthodox Churches, and his feast day is celebrated on July 25.

According to the New Testament, James and his brother John were fishermen before they were called to follow Jesus. House Mass

House Mass is an initiative at St. James to help develop Fr. David's vision of St. James becoming a "Sanctuary in Suburbia".

The idea of House Mass goes back to early Christians who, in small groups, gather in houses to celebrate the Lord's Supper. It typically has a more intimate atmosphere (than a Sunday Mass), and everybody feels more involved in the celebration. The setting also allows time to develop friendships and community.

A Host is however needed to facilitate this happening.

What does the Host of House Mass need to do?

1. Host to liaise with Parish Office on when he/she wishes to host a House Mass.

[Fr. David has allocated specific monthly dates in his diary when he is available for House Mass.] Suggest 8pm start. Provide the Parish Office with your full address / how to get there (as needed), parking restrictions, email, telephone number.

2. Host to invite parishioners to come to the House Mass in his/ her house.

[Suggest host to invite say 8-12 people, but the number of people very much depends on the space/ seating arrangement available in the host's house. The host decides how many and who to invite to the House Mass. It will be good to invite a mix of parishioners, particularly new parishioners, and parishioners who are less involved as one of the objectives of the house mass is to form friendship/ communities]

3. Host to arrange reader(s) from the attendees. (usually 1st reading + psalm) and someone to bring up offertory.

[The reading will normally be the Daily Mass readings, and that will be sent to you by the Parish office one week before the event. If you wish to use other readings, please discuss and agree with Fr. David beforehand]

4. Host to arrange chairs for everyone (including yourself and priest) – usually around the room. A small table with white cloth will also be needed as altar.

5. Host to provide tea & coffee or other drinks after Mass. Suggest host to ask attendee to bring simple nibbles to share for the social.



Remembering our Loved Ones in a Special Way over the Christmas Period

Reaching Out

Christmas can be a particularly lonely time for people who are living on their own. Let us be cognisant of those around us, especially the elderly & bereaved, who may have no-one with whom to share & celebrate the festivities.

A gesture of warmth such as a simple Christmas card could make a huge difference to someone who feels isolated, particularly when they may be missing the joy of Christmasses past & the precious company of their loved ones.

Age UK has a telephone friendship service which offers older people a weekly phone call. Last year they supported over 28,000 people over Christmas with their Service. An extract from their website reads:

"What is telephone friendship?

As we get older, we may find we spend more time on our own. This can sometimes feel lonely, boring or make us miss friends or family. If you or someone you know is missing the joy of regular conversation, Age UK and our partner charity The Silver Line can help.

We offer free telephone friendship services so you can enjoy chatting with someone over the phone, all from the comfort

of your own home. Whether you'd like to speak to someone every week, or just want to talk when the need strikes, we're here to help.

We have two different telephone friendship services available.

• Regular telephone friendship service. We match over-60s with a friendly volunteer for a weekly chat. Our service has helped create hundreds of new friendships, and many people tell us their calls are the highlight of their week. To get started, just tell us a bit about yourself and we'll do the rest.

• The Silver Line Helpline, a 24-hour service. Our charity, The Silver Line, is a free confidential telephone service just for older people. We provide people with friendship, conversation and support 24 hours a day, 365 days a year. Tel (free & confidential) 0800-70-80-90.

Our telephone friendship services may not be as helpful for people with memory loss,dementia or mental health issues who need a higher level support. These conditions may affect the person's ability to build a telephone friendship and, in some instances, people with these conditions may actually find the calls more distressing.

If you're not sure if our telephone friendship services can support you or someone you know, please call 0800 434 6105 to get in touch with us and we'll be happy to help you find the right support."

House Mass

House Mass is an initiative at St. James to help develop Fr. David's vision of St. James becoming a "Sanctuary in Suburbia".

The idea of House Mass goes back to early Christians who, in small groups, gather in houses to celebrate the Lord's Supper. It typically has a more intimate atmosphere (than a Sunday Mass), and everybody feels more involved in the celebration. The setting also allows time to develop friendships and community.

A Host is however needed to facilitate this happening.

What does the Host of House Mass need to do?

1. Host to liaise with Parish Office on when he/she wishes to host a House Mass.

[Fr. David has allocated specific monthly dates in his diary when he is available for House Mass.] Suggest 8pm start. Provide the Parish Office with your full address / how to get there (as needed), parking restrictions, email, telephone number.

2. Host to invite parishioners to come to the House Mass in his/ her house.

[Suggest host to invite say 8-12 people, but the number of people very much depends on the space/ seating arrangement available in the host's house. The host decides how many and who to invite to the House Mass. It will be good to invite a mix of parishioners, particularly new parishioners, and parishioners who are less involved as one of the objectives of the house mass is to form friendship/ communities]

3. Host to arrange reader(s) from the attendees (usually 1st reading + psalm) and someone to bring up offertory.

[The reading will normally be the Daily Mass readings, and that will be sent to you by the Parish office one week before the event. If you wish to use other readings, please discuss and agree with Fr. David beforehand]

4. Host to arrange chairs for everyone (including yourself and priest) – usually around the room. A small table with white cloth will also be needed as altar.

5. Host to provide tea & coffee or other drinks after Mass. Suggest host to ask attendees to bring simple nibbles to share for the social.


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Parish Overseas Project Update & Appeal Supporting the Divine Providence Hospital, El Salvador In collaboration with Archbishop Romero Trust

The JPIC group are continuing work with the Archbishop Romero Trust on the Parish Overseas Project to support the Divine Providence Hospital in El Salvador, which provides palliative care to the community in San Salvador.

The Diocese of Southwark has established a close link with the Sisters of the Carmelite Community who run the Hospital and a strong devotion to St. Oscar Romero who lived at the hospital grounds and was killed there while celebrating mass.

Our Parish is providing support to the Hospital through funding the procurement of an equipment sterilisation unit (Autoclave) and further support to contribute towards other requirements including installation of Solar panels to support reduction in energy bills and use of solar energy.

Parish Peace Garden Update

In 2014 St. James the Great Parish received the Live Simply Award for the Live Simply Garden. As with everything Covid impacted, this Garden space was one of those with lack of maintenance. This space required maintenance and transformation.

In July 2023, the JPIC team along with a group of Parishioners under the direction of Joe Falzon and Mel Deasy embarked upon a journey to transform this Live Simply space to a Peace Garden in keeping with Pope Francis' call for living in Peace and Harmony and Care for our Common home. The intention is for our Parishioners to use this space for peaceful reflection and to encourage Parish groups to conduct meetings and sessions when weather permits. This space will consider eco requirements including use of solar energy and eco-friendly materials where possible. In summary, features and considerations include:

1. A welcoming, inclusive, accessible and visible space with focus on the theme of peace.

2. Water features and landscaping aspects that are ecofriendly and use solar energy.

3. Wild growing space with bug hotels, natural feeders, hedgehog houses etc.

4. Fruit trees and our own flowers / plants for altar decoration.

On 1st October 2023 Father David celebrated the Peace themed mass organised by JPIC group and inaugurated the Peace Garden journey. Father David also blessed the installed statue of St. Francis of Assisi. This tied in nicely with blessing of pets on 10 th October 2023 and the Parish Pilgrimage to Assisi.

We used the opportunity for the planting of two fruit trees, namely Medlar and Quince. These were planted in Memory of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II and to commemorate the coronation of King Charles III.

Our next step is to implement hard landscaping, install a pergola and create a pathway to make the Garden

accessible with appropriate signage. We intend to complete this work by the beginning of Spring 2024 (weather permitting).



One very full car load of your donations was delivered to the centre's storage facility in Bermondsey on 17 November. It is located in a railway arch as you will see in the picture. The Justice, Peace and the Integrity of Creation group would like to thank all those who donated to this biannual collection. Also, a big thank you to Suzanne and Caroline in the Parish Office for sorting and storing everything ready for delivery. Please see the thank you note received from the Manna Society administrator below.

Thank you for St James' donation of food to the Manna Centre and a genuine thank you for taking the time to deliver your goods to us. The food that we have received will be used throughout the next twelve months to provide meals to some of the poorest members of our society.

The work we do here is a practical and compassionate response to poverty and homelessness. The majority of our funding and our foodstuffs come from the Christian community. Without the continuing generosity of our supporters, we would be unable to continue our work.

A breakfast, a hot, nutritious meal and washing facilities are available 7 days a week, Housing & Welfare Advice (in two formats) five days a week, a clothing store once a week, three medical surgeries weekly and access to computers from Monday to Friday. On an average day we see about 120 people. Approximately 50% of our service users are rough sleepers, 10% in secure socially rented accommodation and the remaining 40% in some form of temporary accommodation (hostels, friends & privately rented accommodation) – November 23 statistics. In addition to the services mentioned above, we offer a place of respite and acceptance.

Despite being one advice worker short, in October, we carried out 317 advice tasks (e.g. providing benefits advice, finding accommodation, sorting out ID etc) for 122 clients. A new advice worker will begin with us at the end of November.

We are dependent on voluntary donations to raise approximately 88% of our annual £540,000 budget.



Without your support we would be unable to offer the services we do. Any help you can give, financially or practically (food or men's clothing) throughout the year, will benefit some of the poorest members of our society.

Our adventure commenced as we soared from Heathrow to Rome, the culmination of two years of eager anticipation. Nestled in the heart of Rome, our sanctuary was the Hotel Emmaus, a stone's throw from St Peter's Square. Braving the unseasonal warmth, we joined the pilgrimage to the majestic St Peter's Basilica, a sanctuary of art and history, housing Michelangelo's masterpiece, "Madonna della Pietà", and the eternal resting place of countless Popes. Our spiritual journey was marked by our inaugural Pilgrimage Mass at Santa Maria delle Grazie alle Fornici.

The dawn of a new day brought us face-to-face with Pope Francis at his Weekly General Audience. Fortune smiled upon us as we secured front-row seats, offering an intimate view of the pontiff. His heartfelt address paid homage to St. Josephine Bakhita, a beacon of forgiveness and resilience.

Our spiritual exploration led us to Santo Spirito in Sassia for Mass, its entrance adorned with a Union Jack. We embarked on a historical journey through the Archbasilica of St.John Lateran, the oldest public church in Rome, and the Basilica Papale di Santa Maria Maggiore, a frequent sanctuary for Pope Francis. Amidst these profound experiences, we celebrated life and love, marking two birthdays and two Golden Wedding Anniversaries.

Our journey meandered to Perugia, the Etruscan city famed for its delectable chocolate, Baci. Here, under the vaulted ceilings of the Cattedrale di San Lorenzo, Fr David celebrated Mass. Our path then led us to Assisi, the birthplace of St Francis, where we found solace at Hotel San Pietro.

In the tranquil town of Assisi, we paid homage at the Basilica of St Francis and the Basilica Santa Chiara, a tribute to St Clare, a devout follower of St Francis. We stood in awe before the original Cross at San Damiano and found peace in the serene crypt of the Basilica of St Francis.

Our spiritual quest took us to the serene Eremo delle Carceri on Monte Subasio, a sanctuary of solitude for St. Francis. Our journey culminated at the UNESCO World Heritage Site of San Damiano, nestled amidst olive trees, where St Francis was divinely inspired to restore God's Church. This sacred site later became the home of St Clare's Order of Poor Clares.

In Assisi, we visited the Chiesa di Santa Maria Maggiore and the Sanctuary of the Renunciation, the final resting place of Blessed Carlo Acutis. We also visited the Basilica Santa Maria Degli Angeli, enclosing the Porziuncola where St Francis breathed his last. A special Mass was celebrated in honor of Louise & John Curran's 50th anniversary.

Our journey continued to Siena, where we were greeted by a parade of horses at Piazza del Campo. We visited the Basilica Cateriniana, dedicated to St Catherine of Siena, and the impressive Siena Cathedral, a treasure trove of works by Donatello & Michelangelo. A Mass was celebrated in honor of June & Trevor Christmas's Golden Wedding Anniversary. Our journey found respite in Montecatini, at the Grand Hotel Vittoria.

In Florence, we visited the Basilica di Santa Maria Novella for Mass, followed by a tour of the adjoining museum and the ancient Santa Maria Novella Pharmacy. We ended the day at the Basilica del Santa Croce, housing the tombs of notable Italians and marks of a historic flood. The final day of our pilgrimage was spent at the Uffizi Art Gallery, immersing in masterpieces of renowned artists. We revisited the Basilica of Santa Croce for our final Mass before heading to Pisa airport. Our journey concluded with a fond farewell to our guide Sinéad, driver Stefano, and beautiful Italy, captured in our Official Pilgrimage Photo.
