She is survived by three children: Julie of Santa Cruz, CA, Steve (Diane) of Anchorage, AK, and John (Ashley) of Santa Cruz, CA; five grandchildren: Isaac Conway-Stenzel, Lisa Conway and James Conway of California, Emily Marenco and Marlee Conway of Alaska and a step-granddaughter, Faye Perry (Bevan) of California; two great grandsons, Donovan and Griffin and Faye's children Cassidy and Sawyer. Also surviving are four siblings: Charles Struck, Ruthann Ulstad, Larry Struck and Ron Struck and all their wonderful families.

Shirley was preceded in death by her husband, Jim; her son, Dan; her parents; her brothers, Wallace, Donald and Orlyn; her sisters, Marlys and Dorothea; and her nephew, Brett; as well as her Conway in-laws and out-laws.
