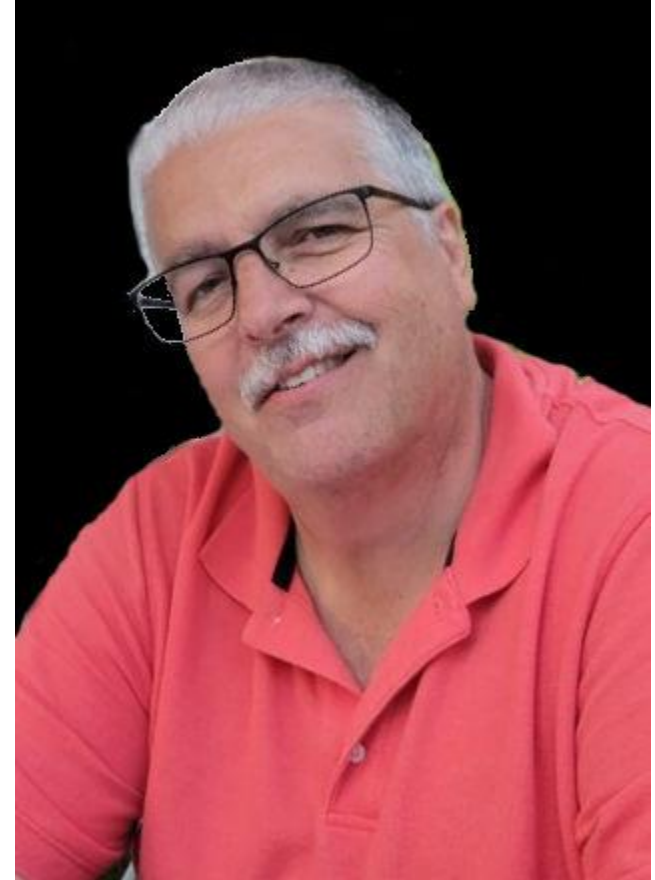


Remembering the Life of
