Lawrence Fielden Jordan, Jr., age 81, passed away peacefully on March 29, 2024, at his home in Orem, UT.

He was born in Salt Lake City, Utah, on February 16, 1943, the son of Lawrence Fielden Jordan Sr. and Rozella Cromar Jordan.

He served an LDS mission in the Southwest British Mission, London, England and afterward, married his sweetheart, Miriam Ivie, in the Salt Lake City Temple on April 29, 1965. 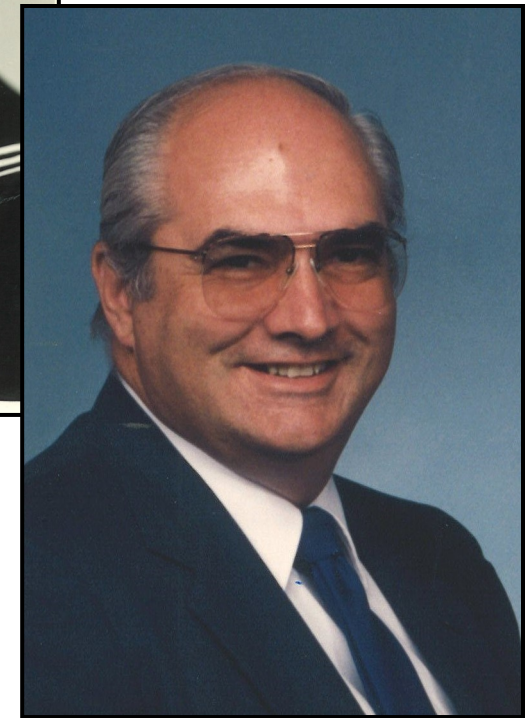
