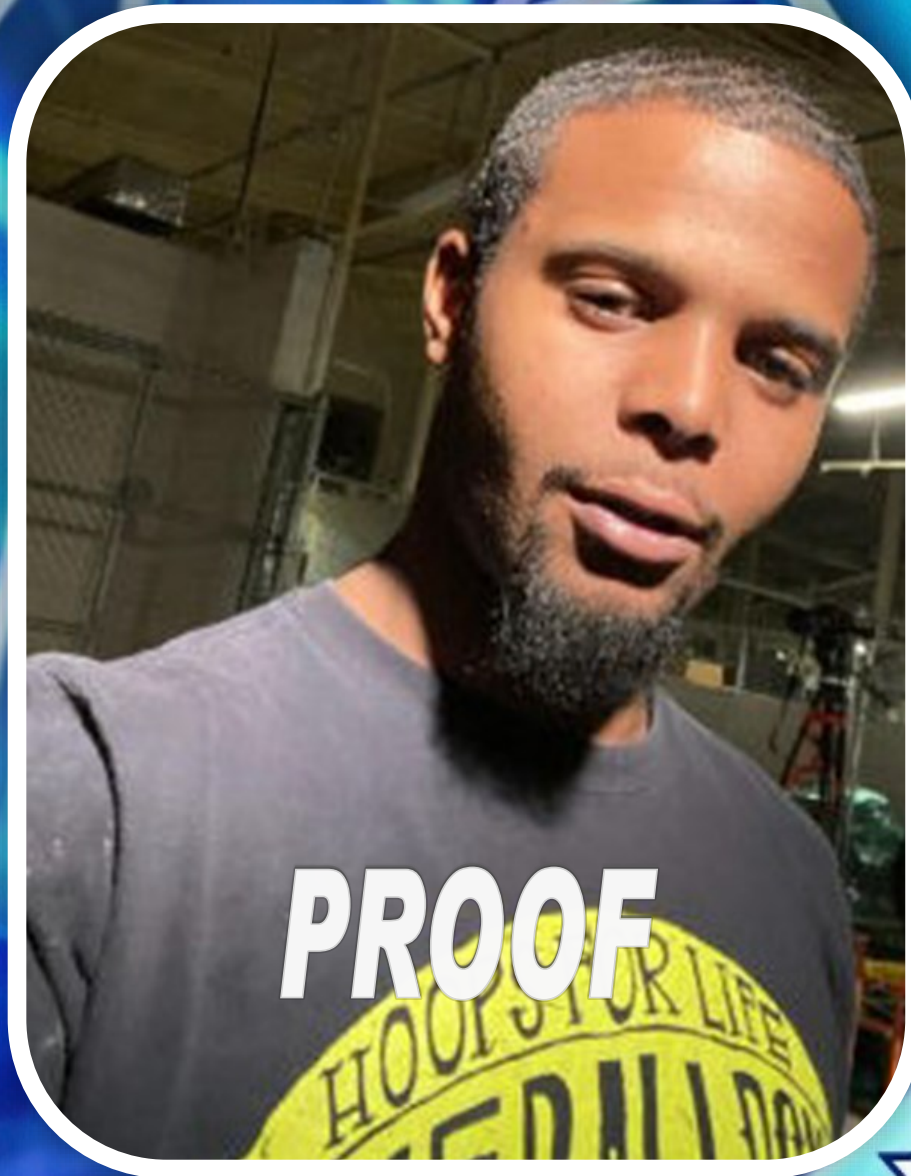

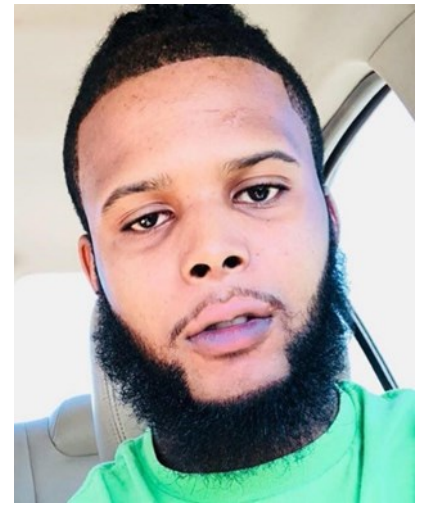

You Never Said Goodbye

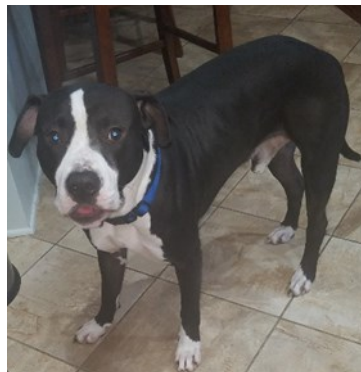
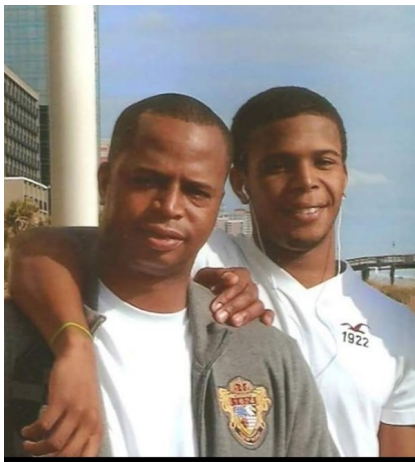

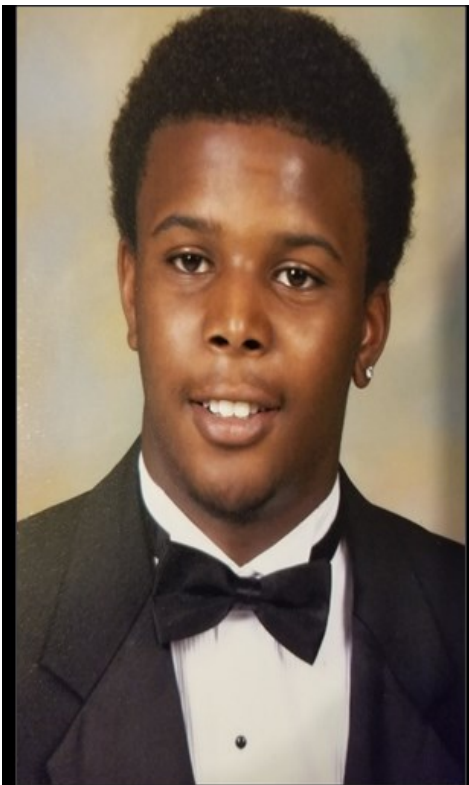
*You never said I'm leaving
