For 25 years she worked for St. Michael's Hospital as a nurse on the floor, clinic nurse, infection control nurse and disaster preparedness. Sharon was also a Community Health Nurse for Bon Homme County and a nurse at the Mike Durfee State Prison.

Sharon was united in marriage to Ronald James Becvar on June 19, 1971. To this union was born their daughter, Kristen Marie. Ron and Sharon lived on a farm southwest of Tyndall until Ron's death in October 1994. Sharon married Donald Ray Hauck on August 30, 1996 and lived on Don's farm until her passing.
