Mrs. Nettie Mae Jones-LeGrand-Hubbard was born on March 10, 1941, in Camden, S.C. She gained her angel wings on March 16, 2024, at the age of 83. She was the daughter of the late Rev. Lewis Henry Jones Sr. (Associate Pastor of White Oak Baptist Church 1945 – 1980) and the late Mrs. Ellen Cooke-Jones.

Nettie received her early religious training and accepted Jesus Christ as her Lord and Savior at White Oak Baptist Church where she was baptized. Under her father's tutelage, Nettie served diligently as she learned about the church's history, by-laws, general church business, and most importantly biblical principles.
