

- OBITUARY -

Charles Leon Speight, affectionately known by family and friends as "Little Joe," was born September 29th 1963, in Wilson, North Carolina to the late Freeman and Irene Speight. He entered into his eternal rest on October 4, 2023 at the family home in Stantonsburg, North Carolina.

Charles loved life. He was kind-hearted and always willing to lend a helping hand. He was thoughtful and protective of his big "little" sister, Sylvia. He always said he was fine when you asked him how he was doing, even when he was in pain. He never complained, no matter how he felt. He rarely argued or became upset. He was always calm. Charles was mild-mannered, always cheerful and most importantly always willing to help others. Charles "Little Joe," was the baby brother of the family and sometimes treated as such. Charles accepted Christ at an early age and he was a long-standing member of St Luke Free Will Baptist Church in Stantonsburg, NC. He left the area, and upon his return years later, he renewed his membership with his home church.

Charles graduated from Beddingfield Senior High School in Stantonsburg, NC in 1981. After graduating he joined the United States Navy and served for nine years. He received an honorary discharge in 1990. While serving in the Philippines, he met and married Posai Manzana. They moved to Silver Springs, Maryland where he became an active member of the community and The People's Baptist Church of Silver Springs, MD. After five years, the marriage was dissolved and Charles moved to Durham, North Carolina. He worked in the Healthcare field for over twenty-five years.

Charles was an active member of Oak Grove United American Baptist Church of Durham NC. Charles was dedicated to the gospel group he sang with, The Mighty Gospel Inspirational Singers. He sometimes even sang with his oxygen mask on and with the tank in tow.

Charles eventually retired from the Healthcare field due to his own failing health. After retiring, he moved back to Stantonsburg, NC where he was cared for under the watchful eye of his brother, Tommy. His brother prepared home cooked meals every day and occasionally accompanied him to his doctors' appointments at the Veterans Hospital in Durham, NC.

Charles renewed his membership at St. Luke Free Will Baptist Church. He was a devout Christian who loved going to church and attending bible study. He faithfully attended St. Luke Free Will Baptist Church and Now Faith Missionary Baptist Church, both located in Stantonsburg, NC. Charles always stayed connected to his roots in the church.

Charles was preceded in death by his parents, Freeman, Sr. and Irene Speight; one brother, Freeman Speight, Jr.; four sisters, Earlene Taylor, Ethel Monk, Minnie Speight and Grace Newkirk; three nephews, Anthony Taylor, Perry Speight and Derrick Suggs.
