After graduating from Central High School in Alexandria, Joyce went on to graduate from Alexandria Technical School and received her LPN license. While at the hospital Joyce met Arlington Peterson, who would become her partner until his passing in 2010. The couple moved to Tempe, Arizona where she soon continued her nursing career. A few years before Arlington passed away, the couple made their last move, building their beautiful home overlooking Lake Mina, outside of Alexandria, where Joyce lived until her passing on May 12, 2022.

Joyce loved her feline companions and talked of them as a mother would her children. Her care for them went above and beyond the norm. The birds were always fed and the deer had an adequate supply of corn. She had a deep concern for the Earth and was involved with many environmental causes. Joyce was knowledgeable on nutrition and unafraid to share her guidance with family. She could talk politics and spirituality with the best of them.

Shortly before her death, the close-knit family gathered to feast together, at which time Joyce shared a Native American reading that was especially meaningful to her and spoke of her transition to come. She knew who she was and was strong in her beliefs.

Joyce was preceded in death by her parents, her life partner Arlington, her oldest sister Vergene (Stanley Lund) and her nephew, Cameron Bolton. She leaves behind her two beloved cats, Ella and Whitey, siblings Arlys, Robert (JoAn), Arlan (Bonnie), Loren, Danny (Julie), Kathy (Ronnie Nelson), Bruce (Terri), Patty (Joel Levie), many nieces and nephews, special friend, Merill Kiehne.
