She was the daughter of the late Dorothy Elizabeth Brown and Frank Hicks, born in Norristown, Pennsylvania.

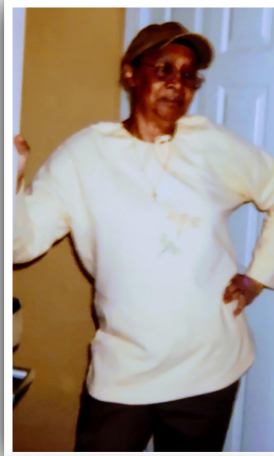
