

James Louis Husarik, "Jim", (aka. Ron) 79, Lake Park, Minnesota, died March 12, 2022, at his home, surrounded by his family, in Ethos Hospice Care, after a battle with pancreatic cancer.

Jim was born on December 14, 1942 in Flushing, Ohio, to Joseph and Margaret (DeMarco) Husarik. He attended school in Ohio and graduated from Shaw High School, East Cleveland, Ohio, in 1960.

He enlisted in the Air Force in 1961 and served for four years of active duty and two years of reserve duty. He was stationed at the Finley, North Dakota Radar base. Here he met his future wife, Gloria Ruth Olson of Mayville, ND, at a local roller-skating rink. They married in Mayville on August 21, 1965, beginning a long life together. Their married life began in Ft. Lauderdale, FL, where Jim worked in various positions at RCA, Pratt Whitney in manufacturing and testing jet engines, and Burroughs Corporation.

While in Florida, Jim and Gloria welcomed the birth of two of their three sons, James Anthony in 1967, and Timothy John in 1968.

They relocated to Minnesota in 1973 and built their own home in rural Lake Park on Canary Lake. That year Shane Matthew was born completing their family. Jim pursued self-employment in construction, concrete work, and trucking. In 1985 he joined SJ Electro Systems and worked as Maintenance Coordinator until he retired in 2006.

Jim was a man of a strong Christian faith. He was active in his church, Trinity Lutheran, and enjoyed singing in the choir. He was involved in church leadership in his life.


