In Bible class this week we learned about Obedience as a good character trait. We also talked about respecting our classmates and saying no to

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bullying. We made stick puppets and each group acted out skits on bullying using their puppets. We read about bullying, sent home flyers on bullying, and signed a pledge to stop bullying.

Math for 5th grade focused on single and double digit multiplication and long division. Students solved many multi-step problems using multiplication and division.
