Marlene Viola Mann was born to Henry and Viola (Lorenzen) Kindt in Luverne, Minnesota. Following her eighth grade year, Marlene continued her education and attended Luverne High School in Luverne, graduating with the class of 1964. She then went to work for a short time at Terrace Dairy and then Tri-State Insurance in Luverne. On December 10, 1965 Marlene was united in marriage to Gary Mann at the First Presbyterian Church in Luverne. The couple made their home in Luverne. In addition to being a wife and mother, Marlene began working at the Luverne High School in the library.
