



As a child he developed an artistic eye which developed into drawing and making picture collages. His eye for art went far beyond the average person's view span. He truly believed you could make something out of nothing. As a young boy, he enjoyed playing all sports with the kids in the neighborhood.

Vincent accepted the Lord & Savior Jesus Christ at an early age and attended church with his family at the Ebenezer COGIC under the tutelage of Elder Robert A. Bady Sr. then the Christian Youth Rally, under the tutelage of Dr. Marlene D. Talley.

Vincent pursued his formal education in the Philadelphia Public School District. Graduating as the 1974 class of Downingtown Industrial & Agricultural School. After high school Vincent enlisted in the United States Army. He trained in Fort Jackson South Carolina; Vincent was honorably discharged.
