A tennis player was watching the league match between Hillcrest and North Coast. Apparently there was this really good kid called Kade playing for Hillcrest. I was asked if I knew him. Hell yes, of course I do. In fact KZN Tennis has just nominated him for KZN DSR Junior Sportsman of the Year award! We'll know in Sept if he made top three, but in the meantime, this was our motivation:

Kade was awarded the <u>Victor Ludorum in Grade 10</u>. He also twice gained Honours for tennis - the highest sports achievement at Kearsney College. Furthermore, in the same year he was awarded half colours for Service to the School.

He won the men's singles club championship at Hillcrest Tennis Club and presently plays in the <u>Super League</u> division of the Ethekwini Tennis Association league.

His tournament history is no less impressive. He entered 7 ranked tournaments, winning 3 singles and 2 doubles titles and made quarter finals in 4 events. He qualified for the <u>top 8 U16 National Junior Masters</u> and secured number 1 position in the KZN <u>U19A school side for 2 consecutive years</u>. He made the SA School U17 team tour to Wimbledon.

Kade was selected by the national body for the TSA elite training camp in Stellenbosch as part of **the top 8 next generation players**.

He has participated in 7 ITF national and international tournaments, reaching at least the quarter finals in 6 singles and doubles events.

Tie break rule:


